

**Visitors gallery at ZIA opens**

The newly-built visitors gallery at Zia International Airport was opened Tuesday morning, reports BSS.

State Minister for Civil Aviation and Tourism Abdul Mannan inaugurated the 65-seat capacity visitors gallery, named "Karabi" after the name of Oleander Flower.

With the opening of the new gallery, the visitors, who will come at ZIA to see off outgoing passengers can wait there. Side by side the Civil Aviation Authority can earn about Taka 1.5 lakh per month as ticket money, which is Taka 50 per head.

The inaugural function was also attended by Additional Secretary in charge of the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism Habibur Rahman, Chairman of the Civil Aviation Authority Air Commodore Azharul Huq and Managing Director of Biman Bangladesh Airlines AH Mofazzal Karim.

Speaking on the occasion, the State Minister said the Civil Aviation Authority has built the visitors gallery to extend service facilities within its limited resources.

He said the gallery will be expanded after its shifting to the second terminal building which is expected to be constructed soon.

Mannan said visitors gallery was a long-felt demand as the number of visitors is comparatively high at ZIA.

The State Minister visited different sections of the airport.

**Netrakona, Mymensingh MPs, leaders meet President**

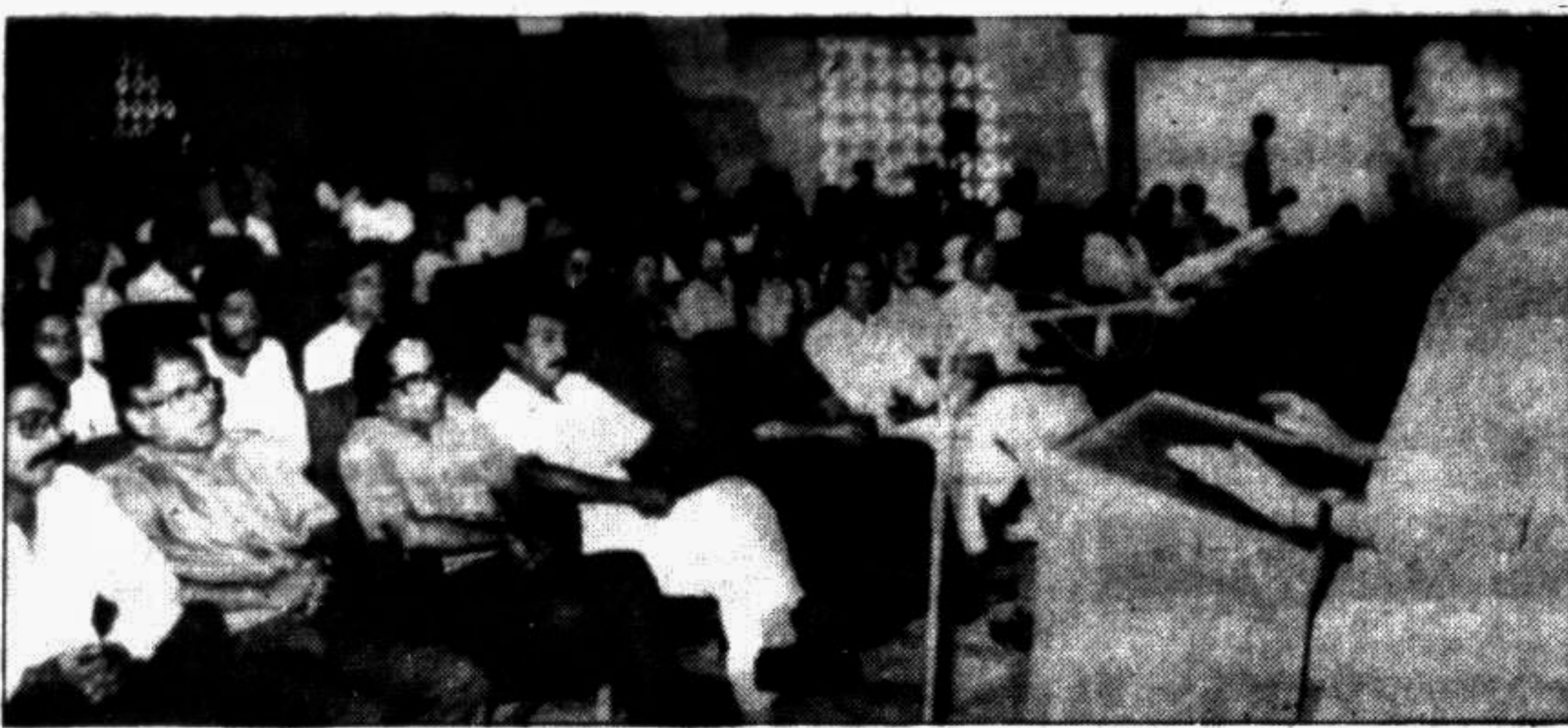

Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury Tuesday directed the police administration to discharge their duties effectively and fearlessly for establishing a corruption-free administrative system, reports BSS.

people should be friendly. Every police official should perform their responsibilities with honesty, sincerity and efficiency, he added.

Chowdhury said law of the land is equal to all whoever is the criminal.

Later, the Home Minister addressed the senior officials of the Home Ministry.

The minister said the Home

Ministry was playing a vital role for the country because it was dealing with security and border of the country. He said the present government was committed to fulfil people's aspiration.

Chowdhury said there was no alternative to corruption-free society ensure overall national development.

Home Secretary Lutfullah Mazid also spoke on the occasion.

She said students of the hall were surprised at the news which not only belittled the image of the organisation but also tarnished that of the hall authorities and students.
