Rly Western Zone earns Tk 88.41 cr

Railway Western Zone earned Tk 88.41 crore during the last fiscal year which was Tk 18 crore higher than the earnings of the previous year, reports BSS.

The earning was Tk 1.41 crore more than the target earnings fixed for the last fiscal year.

This was disclosed to State Minister for Communications Fazlur Rahman at a meeting of the Western Zone officials held at Paksey Thursday, a railway press release said.

132 arrested in city on various charges

Police arrested a total of 132 persons in connection with various charges during the last 24-hours in and around the city.

Two persons were arrested after a daring chase in which crackers were lobbed at police near the Sheraton Hotel on Friday afternoon. A police patrol unit from Ramna Thana challenged a group of about five miscreants in Elephant Road at around 2:30 pm. When they tried to flee on a baby-taxi police chased them on a private car.

Police managed to arrest two of them from in front of the Sheraton Hotel even after two crackers were lobbed at police. Azizur Rahman (21) and Liton (30) were arrested and a cracker and a dagger were recovered from their possession. However, the rest of the members of the group managed to escape.

Gulshan Police recovered stolen cloths worth about Tk 1.28 lakh from a godown of the

Joynal Market in Kaliganj under Keraniganj thana and arrested five persons in this connection. The items were earlier stolen from the Nissan Garments in Mohakhali on Tuesday.

Meanwhile, Tejgaon police arrested one person with a pipe-gun from the Titas Gas Head Office premises in Kawran Bazar on Thursday.

He was identified as Muhammad Latif (21). Tejgaon police is continuing investigations.

4 killed in road mishaps

Four people, including a minor boy, were killed and 20 others injured in two separate road mishaps — one in the city on Friday and the other at Savar Thursday midnight, reports UNB.

Shahed (7) was crushed under the wheels of a speeding minibus (Dhaka-CHA-4219) on Biswa Road near Merul Badda this afternoon. He met with the accident while crossing the road, police said.

Gulshan police seized the minibus and arrested driver Sheikh Babar.

The body was sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) for post mortem.

In another accident Thursday midnight, three persons were killed and 20 others injured when a Khulna-bound nightcoach from Dhaka plunged into a roadside ditch after hitting a parked truck on the highway at Karnapara, Savar, police and hospital sources said.

The dead were identified as Moslemuddin (30) of Kaliganj, a passenger, and two employees of the bus — supervisor Shaiful Islam (27) and the

Gold worth Tk 45 lakh seized at airport

Customs officials seized 540 tolas of gold worth about Taka 45 lakh from the possession of a cleaner of the Engineering Department of Biman at Zia International Airport late Wednesday night.

According to Customs authorities, airport customs with the help of security personnel seized 54 gold bars each weighing 10 tolas from the possession of Rafiqul Islam, a cleaner of the Engineering Department of Biman, about a hour-and-a-half after the Biman flight BG-083 arrived from Singapore at 11.50 pm. Rafiq who was on duty aboard the flight, was apprehended.

Airport security personnel on duty became suspicious of his movements when he emerged from the aircraft after finishing his duty inside.

Customs officials, in the presence of airport security, found the 54 gold bars weighing a total of 540 tolas wrapped in black cloth packets on Rafiq's possession.

Rafiq was handed over to the Cantonment police, where a case was also registered.

Dateline Chittagong

Call to turn CCC into a service-oriented body

CHITTAGONG, Sept 28: Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) Mayor Mir M Nasir Uddin told the officers and employees of the corporation that all concerned would have to work with dedication and honesty to turn it into a service-oriented organisation, reports BSS.

The CCC should earn appreciation from the citizens through its services, he said.

Speaking at a meeting at the CCC Conference Hall Mayor Nasir Uddin said, the success and failure of the corporation would have to be shared equally by all — from a worker to the Mayor of the CCC. He said, our aim should be to develop the port city into a beautiful one.

He said the annual grant for the CCC employees welfare fund would be raised to one lakh Taka.

Ward Commissioner with 3 others held

Police arrested four people including a Ward Commissioner on charge of assaulting a woman who, along with others, had been demanding relief.

According to the sources, the Ward Commissioner of Rangamati Municipality and 3 of his associates mercilessly beat up Nurun Nahar Begum recently, a victim of the April 29 cyclone.

Immediately after the assault, some on-lookers took injured Nurun Nahar to the Deputy Commissioner who arranged her medical treatment.

Local people brought out processions in protest against the incident and demanded punishment to the persons responsible for malpractices in distribution of relief materials among the cyclone victims.

They also submitted memorandum to the Deputy Commissioner and the Local Government Parishad for judicial enquiry into the incident.

The arrested have been sent to jail hayat.

Rangpur flood situation reviewed

Social Welfare and Women's Affairs Minister and Relief Coordinator of greater Rangpur district Tariqul Islam Friday visited flood affected Shapti-bari, Bhadal of Aditmari upazila and Baaura of Patgram upazila. He supervised relief activities at different camps in Lalmonirhat district, reports BSS.

Addressing the flood affected people, the minister said government was supplying adequate quantity of relief material everyday including food, medicine, cloths and goods of daily use to distribute among the flood affected people.

He also asked the concerned official working in the diarrhoea affected areas to speed up motivational campaign along with medical treatment to check the spread of diarrhoeal disease.

The minister also distributed some relief materials.

Earlier, the minister presided over a review meeting on flood situation and relief activities at Deputy Commissioner's office in Lalmonirhat.

Officials of district administration, public representatives, local political leaders, journalists and members of armed forces attended the meeting.

The visiting Assistant Administrator and Director of Regional Bureau for Asia and the Pacific of UNDP, K. G. Singh called on Planning Minister A M Zahiruddin Khan at his office here Thursday, reports BSS.

Resident representatives of UNDP in Bangladesh Charis Henri Larimont was present.

The Minister appreciated the pioneering role of UNDP and discussed UNDP programmes in Bangladesh.

During the discussion the Planning Minister pointed out that the present democratic government would ensure accountability at all levels and enlist people's participation in the planning process. He also emphasised the need for proper monitoring and evaluation of development process.

The visiting UNDP official assured continued UNDP collaboration in the uplift efforts of Bangladesh.
