desk everyday, which he slowly but surely consumes, as the day progresses and the week wears out. Your friends tell you that the best way to avoid a heart attack is to have half a Disprin or Aspirin at night. There are articles on this issue in medical sections of magazines

If someone is feeling miserable because his girl-friend has ditched him or if the husband is taking an unusual interest in some flashy young woman in his office, friends rush to tell him or her that the best medicine for a heartache is Frisium. Others nod in agreement.

In our society there is no hope of going to a pub and drowning one's miseries. If you happen to be a woman the prospects of boozing in the public is out, even in the west, if you care for your reputation. You may not have any trust in psychiatrists. Perhaps earlier they dozed you too much or suggested serious steps like electric shocks or long-drawn out therapies in specialised clinics. So you stick to your friends and when they suggest Seduxen or Valium, you fall for it, and do not consider even having the opinion of the doctor.

If the medicine is doing fine for your friends at your work place and for your acquaintances, it should take care of you too, you feel. Sometimes when one friend visits another with her or his problems, that person is not only given coffee, cigarettes and sympathy but also some Seduxen tablets.

I have known homoeopathic medicines to pass hand too without any consultation with the doctor. Yet the psychological belief that if it has worked with my friends, it will do for me too, works wonders.

When it comes to beauty care like treating of greasy hair, or pimples on the face, or fighting the midriff flab, the amicable advice of friends like "cut out the sweets", "Go for walks", "Avoid greasy food" is taken instead of consulting a beautician or a skin specialist.

Even in case of the new mother's battles with her three young children, the young woman does not necessarily rush to the doctor, when her daughter eries all night, but resorts to what the neighbour suggests, especially if it is a Friday and the clinics are shut .

Massive public works plan from next month

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman said in Dhaka Sunday that the government would undertake massive public works programme from the next month to reactivate the natio-

nal economy, reports BSS. Speaking at a briefing session on the state of national economy sponsored by Overseas Correspondents Association of Bangladesh (OCAB), the Finance Minister said that there was no dearth of resources for funding the development programmes. The size of the annual development programmes would remain intact this year, he hoped.

The Finance Minister said the procedure of the liberalised import policy would be further simplified and relaxed and the margin of letter of credit for the purpose of import would be reduced further.

Dwelling at length on the different aspects of the national economy the Finance Minister reiterated the commitment of the BNP government under the leadership of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia to ensure the welfare of the people through better management of the financial matters with accountability and transparency. Rahman said: "I am con-


