175 posts of teachers lying vacant

JAMALPUR, Sept 30: Inhabitants of Melandah upazila are being deprived of basic civic amenities including supply of drinking water, adequate educational facilities and housing.

Although many people have died of intestinal diseases there is no provision of pure drinking water for a long time. About 60 per cent of the tubewells have long been lying out of order in different upazilas. Neither they are repaired nor new ones were sink as such people of Melandah have to consume impure water from rivers, canals, ponds and ditches thus becoming easy victims of diarrheal diseases.

SYLHET, Sept 30: Taka 54 crore massive rura Electrification Programme has been going on in seven upazilas of the district. According to an official

source, the programme, financed by the World Bank is being implemented by the Rural Electrification Board When contacted the General Manager, Sylhet Palli Biddyut Samity told this correspondent that a total of 965 kilometre power distribution line would be constructed in seven upazilas of the district. The upazilas are, Sylhet Sadar, Golapganj Beantbazar, Jakiganj, Balaganj Biswanath and Fenchugani. Two thousand three hundred thirteen villages in 62 unions of these upazilas would be covered by the programme. About 40 thousand subscribers including domestic, commercial establishments, small and cottage industries and irrigation machines including deep tubewells and low-lift pumps would be provided with the electricity facilities.
