Dhaka-Beijing ties to grow

Agriculture, Irrigation, Water Development and Flood Control Minister M Majid-ul Haq said in Dhaka Wednesday that the bonds of friendship between Bangladesh and China would be further strengthened in the coming days to the benefit of the two peoples, reports BSS.

He was speaking as the chief guest at a function organised by Bangladesh-China Mottree Samity to mark the 42nd founding anniversary of China at Hotel Purbani.

Wishing "all the happiness and prosperity for the people of China on their founding anniversary," Haq recalled that the friendship between the peoples of China and Bangladesh dates back to 1500 years. In this connection, he recounted the role of Atish Dipankar a great scholar, who preached Buddhism in China.

Presided over by Barrister Zulmat Ali Khan, Vice President of Bangladesh-China Friendship Society, the function was addressed by Energy and Mineral Resources Minister Dr. Khondkar Mosharraf Hossain, Environment, Forest, Fisheries and Livestock Minister Abdullah Al-Noman, Works Minister

Barrister Rafiqul Islam Miah, State Minister for Education Principal Yunus Khan, State Minister for Social Welfare and Women Affairs Sarwar Rahman, State Minister for Environment, Forest, Fisheries and Livestock, Gayashwar Roy, Mir Shawkat Ali, MP, Chinese Ambassador in Bangladesh, Chen Song Lu, noted journalist Gias Kamal Chowdhury and Secretary General of the Samity Nazmul Huq Nannu.

A message from the Law and Justice Minister and Founder President of Bangladesh-China Friendship Society, Mirza Golam Haif, was read out on the occasion. Mirza Haif is currently on a tour of Panchagarh and diarrhoea-affected areas.

Barrister Rafiqul Islam Miah lauded the achievements made by China in providing food and basic amenities to its one billion people and said: "We have many things to learn from the Chinese experience in this gigantic task of providing food and jobs to all."

Abdullah Al-Noman described China as a great friend of Bangladesh and said it was the great leader Maulana Abdul Hamid Khan Bhashani who had played a pioneering role in bridging friendship between the two countries.

Mir Shawkat Ali, MP, said China was one of the best friends of Bangladesh. The Chinese Ambassador Chen Song Lu gave a resume of the progress made so far by China in different fields and said his country would continue to support the infrastructure development projects like bridges in Bangladesh.

Gias Kamal Chowdhury described China as a natural ally of Bangladesh in the context of geo-politics.



Anniversary of Ustad Bahadur's death today

The second death anniversary of Ustad Bahadur Hossain Khan, the renowned sarod player of the sub-continent will be observed today (Thursday) says a press release.

Born in 1931 in Shibpur in the district of Brahmanbaria Ustad Bahadur learnt music to his father Ustad Ayet Ali Khan and world famous uncle Ustad Alauddin Khan for 20 years. He was one of the best musicians of the Tansen and Alauddin Gharana.

He started his music career as staff artist in Dhaka Radio in 1949. In 1951 he went to Bombay and joined the famous dance director Shanti Bardwan's 'Little Ballet dance-troupe' as music director. He had tremendous to popularise the Indian classical music to the listeners throughout the world. He visited America, Russia, China, Great Britain, France, Germany, Japan, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Poland and many other countries and enthralled the audience with his unparalleled magic of music.

He was also Professor of Music in the Ali Akbar College of Music in California and Calcutta. He directed music of a good number of feature films. These include Rittik Ghatak's 'Subarnarekha', Titas Ekti Nadir Naam', 'Meghe Dhaka Tara', 'Tri-Sandhyal', 'Jekhane Darye', 'Shet Mayur', 'Palatak', 'Gassam Howa' and many others. He also directed the background music of documentary films titled 'Rabindranath' and 'Jamini Roy'. He has a number of long play and 45 RPM disc records. He died in Calcutta on October 3, 1989.

'Ustad Ayet Ali Khan Sangeet Niketan', Dhaka arranged milad mahfil and discussion on this occasion. A number of cultural organisation are also observing death anniversary of the maestro of music with due solemnity.

The following paragraph was inadvertently omitted from the USIS press release of October 1 concerning the OP-1 visa programme, says a Press release.

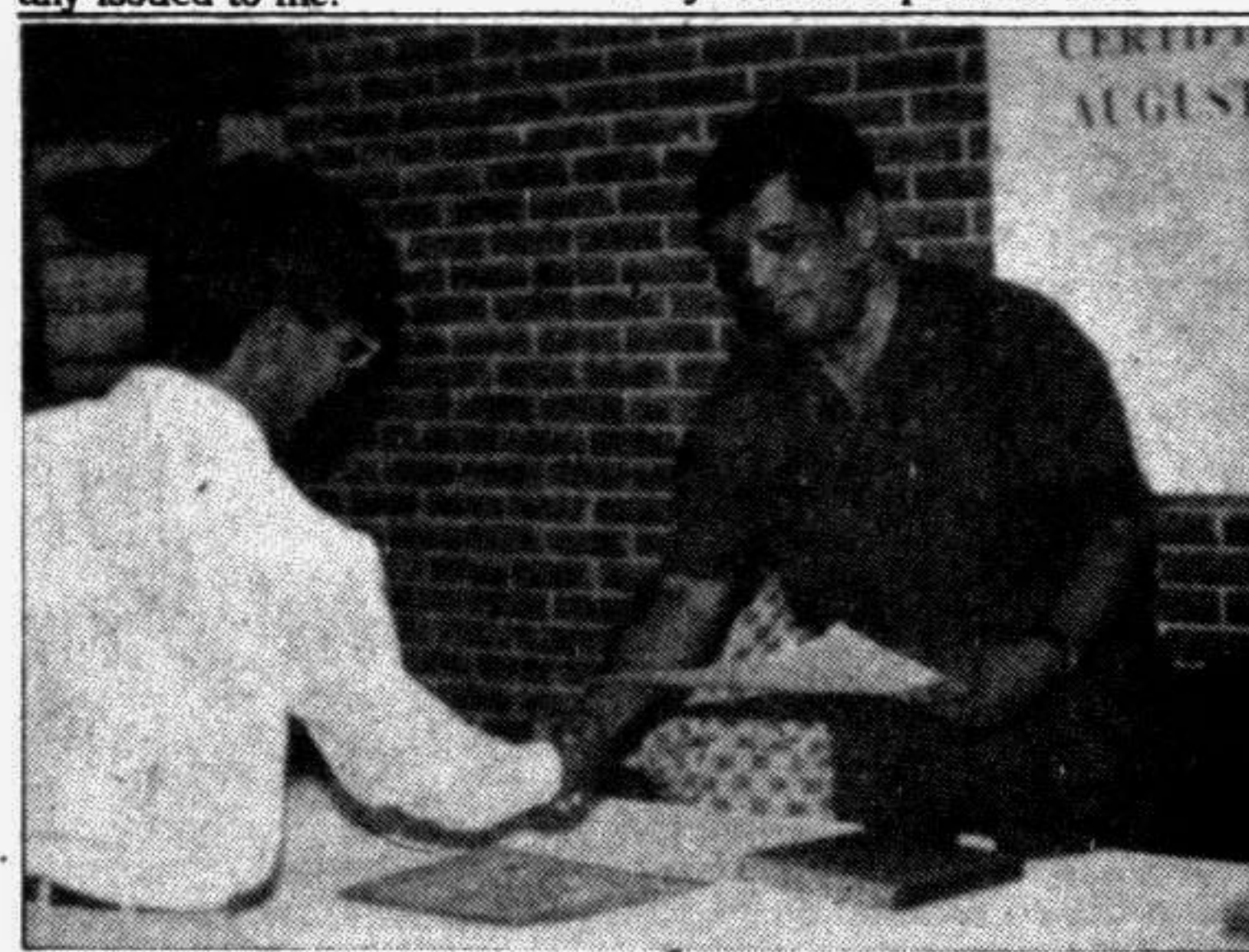

BAU admission begins Oct 7

Admission into the bachelor level courses of Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU) for the session 1990-91 will start from October 7, 1991, a BAU press release said, reports BSS.

The selected candidates from the merit lists are required to collect health cards from the office of the Faculty of Agriculture on that day and on completion of health examinations at the BAU Health Centre, those cards are to be submitted at the office of the specific faculty to which the candidate concerned has been selected for.

The candidates passing the health examination are then to appear before the respective faculty interview board to be held at the office of the concerned Dean of Faculty on October 7 and 8. They must carry with them the admit card for BAU admission test and original certificates for scrutiny by the interview boards. Admission of candidates from merit list will be completed by October 9.

Dateline Khulna

Polytechnic Institute closed

KHULNA, Oct 2 : Khulna Polytechnic Institute was closed since die after rivals' attack left 15 Shibir activists injured on the campus today, reports UNB.

Residents of all four halls of the institute were also asked to vacate by 7 this evening. The decision was taken at a meeting of the institute's governing body in the afternoon after the campus violence, triggered by the attack allegedly launched by Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal supporters.

The injured were identified as Farook Hossain, General Secretary of Islami Chhatra Shibir Polytechnic Institute unit, Maroof Hossain, Moshur,

Nazmul, Kamal, Idris, Afzal, Borhan, Kibria, Alifaz, Ferdous and Lifu.

Twelve of the injured, including seriously wounded Farook Hossain and Maroof Hossain, were admitted to local hospitals. Three were released after first aid.

Witnesses said a well-equipped group stormed classrooms at around 10 am and charged the Shibirites with lethal weapons. Ram-dao, hockey stick and dagger were said to have been used by the attackers.

Frightened Shibirites took shelter in the Principal office, teacher's commonroom and toilet of the institute, but couldn't escape assault, they

said. Institute officials said about 20 to 25 high-power crackers were exploded during the melee.

Property worth about Tk 100,000 was damaged during the attack, they said. Police were deployed on the campus where a tense situation was prevailing.

No arrest was, however, made so far in this connection.

Meanwhile, Chhatra Shibir in a statement called for strike in all colleges in the city and Khulna University, excluding schools.

Both sides filed cases with Khailispur police, none was, however, arrested so far.
