Foreign fishing boat seized

KHULNA, Oct 3 : A patrol craft of Bangladesh Navy apprehended a foreign fishing boat off fair way buoy and arrested all her 12 crew members, according to an ISPR press release today, reports BSS.

The patrol craft routine anti-smuggling and fishery protection mission seized the boat while it was engaged in fishing well inside the territorial waters of Bangladesh.

The impounded boat is being escorted to Mongla for legal action.

NGO training course begins
Another report adds: The five-day training course on 'management' for the directors and leaders of different non-government organisations engaged in health and family planning activities in Khulna division ended in Khulna Thursday.

A total of 25 NGO personnel took part in the training course organised by the Family Planning Service and Training Centre (FPSTC).

In the concluding day function the speakers emphasized the need for this sort of training programme to spread out family planning programme at grass-root level. They also urged the participants to work sincerely in the rural areas of the country in order to help achieve the target of family planning activities.

Biswas praises kindergartens

Former speaker of the Jatiya Sangsad, Abdur Rahman Biswas, Thursday said that the country needed a national consensus to ensure education for all by the year 2000, reports BSS.

He said kindergarten and its other equivalent educational institutions of the country could put in their best endeavours for the improvement of education.

Biswas, who is now a presidential candidate, was speaking as the chief guest at the certificate and prize distribution ceremony at the grand conference of Bangladesh Kindergarten Association at the Shishu Academy in Dhaka.

State Minister for Establishment Mohammad Nurul Huda attended the function as the special guest.

Presided over by ABM Shamsuddin, Chairman of the Association, the function was addressed, among others, by Golam Mustafa, Principal of the Jurain Kindergarten, Shahazada Mohammad Ali, Secretary General and Habibur Rahman Vice-Chairman respectively of the Association.

Lauding the standard of education system of the Kindergarten, Biswas urged the teachers and patrons of learning to mould the mind of the children in the spirit of national history and culture so that the children would be able to evaluate themselves 'on the question of history and national heroes.'

Mohammad Nurul Huda said those persons and institutions which can contribute a lot towards spread of education are the best benevolent to the nation.

'Now-a-days, the quality of education in the Kindergarten is going down as some persons invest in the sector with profit motive, he observed.

'He, however, said the government had decided to private sector.

The government had also directed officials concerned to formulate a policy with regard to private educational institutions, he said adding that present government would also patronize the private educational sector for achieving the universal education for all.

Shahazada Mohammad Ali, Secretary-General of the Association, said about six lakh students are studying in 3,500 Kindergarten schools and 40,000 teachers and 10,000 employees are working in those schools.

He demanded government's initiative to give registration and proper patronization to the Kindergartens of the country.

A total of 187 students got primary and junior scholarships at different grades last year.

Five-party
Central Five-party on Thursday demanded to start Food for Works Programme immediately in the flood-hit northern region of the country.

At a steering committee meeting of the Alliance with Convenor Bimal Biswas in the chair adopted a resolution that a famine-like situation has been prevailing in the said areas for quite a long time. Devastating flood washed away crops of the fields. Moreover about a week-long transport strike multiplied the miseries of the people but the government has not taken any steps to save the victims.

The Five-party will hold a rally in front of JSD office on Sunday to press home their demands.

The meeting was addressed among others by Tipu Biswas, AFM Mahbulul Haq, Sharif Nurul Ambia, Nayim Jahangir, Saiful Haq, and Mirnal Sen.

Jamaat
The Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh on Thursday condemned the attack on Shibir workers by the ruling party's students wing JCD at Khulna Polytechnic Institute on Wednesday.

Nayeb-e-Amir of the party Shamsur Rahman in a statement said the terror groups of JCD have been unleashing its heinous acts for quite a long time but no appropriate action has so far been taken against them.

The Jamaat leader demanded arrest and punishment to those involved in the incident.

Garib Dal
Bangladesh Garib Dal on Thursday supported the programmes of movement of NAP (Bhasari) to eliminate poverty from the country.

At a rally in Nilkhet area with party President Joyal Abedin in the chair, the leaders referred to the disparity between the rich and the poor in past years.

No programme has been taken to eliminate poverty during the last 20 years in the country.

OP-1
The OP-1 Winners Association on Thursday demanded to publish the name and addresses of those who were issued visas under OP-1 programme from Bangladesh. They also demanded to publish the name of lottery winners.

In a press release Convenor of the Association Akram Hossain said that according to the International Law, all the lottery winners should get visas but how the programme was completed without issuing visas to many lottery winners.

He further said Bangladeshis was never dissatisfied with the OP-1 programme as reported in some newspapers, rather they are thankful to the government and people of United States.

The Association will soon announce its fresh course of action, the press release added.
