Moreover, PWD Club are reported to have spent quite a large amount to form their

team for the 1991-92 scason, recrusting players from such big clubs as Abahani and Brothers Union.

But yesterday, they cut a sorry figure with another lacklustre display.

Wanderers held the upper hand for the first sixty minutes and only in the last twenty minutes did PWD try to prove themselves with some enterprising raids.

Goalkeeper Arun, three frontline players - Dizu, Belal and Mustaguim - were the picks of the Wanderers' players while goalkeeper Lahul and Sri Lankan veteran Packeer Ally their player-cum-coach were the PWD players who gave some valiant display in front of an encouraging holiday


