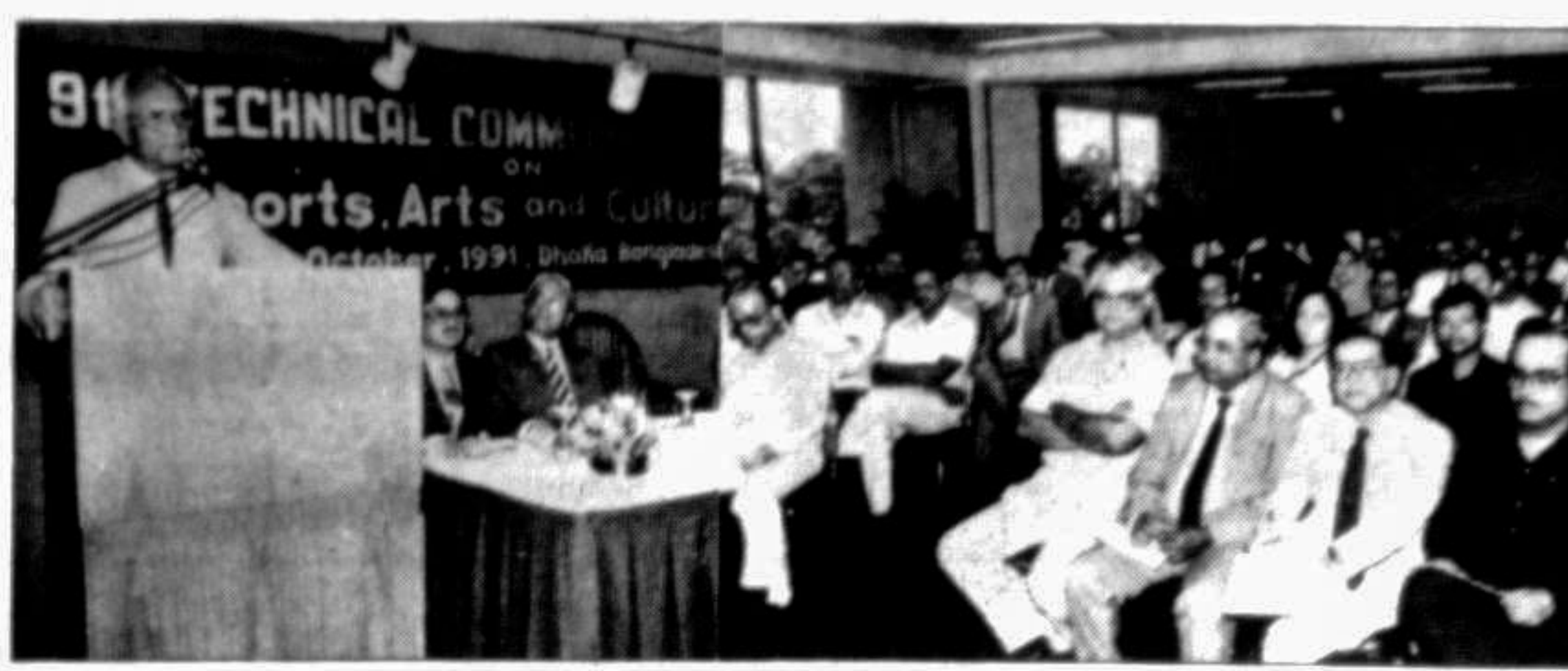

**Govt college teachers to  
continue work stoppage**

Bangladesh Government College Lecturers Association (BGCLA) Monday urged the authorities of all colleges to abstain from distribution and receiving of admission forms, holding admission tests and taking classes, a BGCLA press release said, reports BSS.

The BGCLA, in a resolution adopted at a meeting held at the Dhaka College Teachers' auditorium, also demanded the implementation of its 12-point charter of demands which included the call for filling up of 6,000 vacant posts and creating 3000 new posts in 114 affiliated colleges.

The BGCLA, in the press release said, if its demands were not met by November 10, it will hold a rally at Mirpur Bangla College on November 11 to mobilise greater movement.

BGCLA decided in the meeting that it would continue their work stoppage for indefinite period and urged the Bangladesh Government College Teachers' Society, BCS General Education Society, and Bangladesh Government College Teachers' Council to chalk out similar programmes side by side with them.

The meeting was presided over by Kamal Ataur Rahman, which was addressed by Abdus Samad, Nazreen Begum, Momtaz Begum, and Saleh Uddin.

**Post-flood situation reviewed**

RAJSHAHI, Oct 8: A discussion meeting of Rajshahi Divisional Relief and Rehabilitation Coordination Committee was held here Sunday at the Divisional Commissioner's office, reports BSS.

Presided over by Rajshahi Divisional Commissioner N A Habibullah, the meeting was attended by Additional Commissioner M Aminul Islam, Assistant Commissioner Md. Tipu Sultan and other concerned high officials of different districts.

Reviewing the post flood situation of the division it was informed in the meeting that 1,066.60 kms of pucca road, 48,467.15 kms of kutcha road, 4,83,307 acres, 1,001 bridges and culverts, 251 educational institutions were damaged fully in an area of 8,697.69 square kms of 574 unions and 1,068 kms of pucca road, 4,308.12 kms of kutcha road, 3,15,285 houses, crops on 6,54,587 acres, 566 bridges and culverts and 1,457 educational institutions were partly damaged in an area of 1,606.50 square kms of 297 unions.

Besides, 617 people died of diarrhoea and 56,139 people were attacked with water borne diseases in the division. For emergency rehabilitation programme of the affected people, departments of agriculture, fisheries and livestock LGEED education, roads and high ways etc. Submitted list of requirements in cash and kinds in the coordination committee.

Divisional Commissioner assured all concerned departments that he would try his best to help them get necessary requirements for the implementation of the rehabilitation programme.

**Day temperature may rise**

Rain or thundershower is likely to occur at a few places over Dhaka and Chittagong divisions and at one or two places, over Rajshahi and Khulna divisions during 24 hours ending at 6 pm today (Wednesday), reports UNB.

Met office says day temperature is likely to rise by 1 to 2 degree Celsius over the country.

The maximum temperature recorded in Dhaka Tuesday was 33 degree Celsius and the minimum 25 degrees.
