**Withdrawal of Upazila Court under study**

Law and Justice Minister Mirza Gohar Hossain said the withdrawal of Upazila Court was under active consideration of the government, reports BSS.  
He was addressing as the chief guest a meeting of the members of Dhaka Bar Association.  
Works Minister Rafiqul Islam and Chief Whip Khandakar Delwar Hossain also addressed the meeting as special guests.  
Mirza Hossain stressed the need for welfare laws aiming at building the society based on equal justice. He urged the lawyers irrespective of political affiliation to contribute towards establishing a social order to ensure rights and privileges of the people.  
He said law being a social science should be streamlined to bring welfare to the common people.  
The Works Minister said these should have been an in-

dependent judiciary to establish Rule of Law. He said transition to democracy was possible due to sacrifice of the people.  
The Chief Whip lauded the contribution of lawyers towards Parliamentary democracy.  
Earlier, the ministers visited Dhaka Judge Court building and discussed with judicial officials about prevailing problems and ways and means to solve them.

Pre-requisites for admission

1. M.D (Internal Medicine) : Two years' whole time residential training in Medicine or one year's residential training in Medicine and one year's residential training in Gastroenterology, Cardiology, Paediatrics, Neuro-Medicine or Nephrology.
2. M.D (Paediatrics) : Two years' whole time residential training in Paediatrics or six months' residential training in Medicine and 1½ yrs. residential training in Paediatrics.
3. M.D (Nephrology) : Two years' whole time residential training in Medicine or one year's residential training in Medicine and one year's residential training in Nephrology.
4. M.D (Dermatology) : Two years' whole time residential training in Dermatology or six months' residential training in Medicine and 1½ year's residential training in Dermatology.
5. M.D (Gastroenterology) : Two years' whole time residential training in Medicine or one year's residential training in Medicine and one year's residential training in Gastroenterology.
6. M.D (Anaesthesiology) : Two years' whole time residential training in Anaesthesiology or 1½ years' residential training in Anaesthesiology and 6 months' residential training in Medicine or Surgery.

Candidates having a diploma from Dhaka University in their respective subjects would be allowed 6 months' exemption in their training pre-requisites.

Doctors having training in Modernised District and Sub-Divisional Hospitals under a fully qualified consultant and in Mirzapur Hospital and Holy Family Hospital will get the benefit of a maximum of one year's training.

For admission into the Postgraduate courses, preference would be given to candidates who have served in Upazila Health Complex or Rural Dispensary for at least one year.

Private doctors may also apply for admission to the courses mentioned above having pre-requisites for the course applied for.

All eligible candidates will have to appear for a written admission test which will be held on the 13.11.1991 at 9.00 AM and candidates who would qualify in the written examination will be called for Viva-Voce Examination.

Prescribed application forms would be available from the Office of the Director of Institute of Postgraduate Medicine and Research, Dhaka on cash payment of Tk. 50.00 (Taka fifty) only. Application together with attested copies of MBBS certificates, Testimonials and Training Certificate must reach the undersigned on or before 31.10.1991. Original Certificates must be produced at the time of Viva-Voce Examination.

Doctors in Government Service will have to apply through proper channel with an advanced copy to the Institute. No candidate is permitted to apply for more than one course. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

**DCCI training courses to improve management skills**

Development of scientific management technique is a pre-requisite for efficiency and productivity for Bangladesh enterprises, said Mr Nasimuddin Ahmed, Secretary, Ministry of Commerce while distributing certificates to the participants of a month-long training course on financial management, reports BSS.

The function was organised by the Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry (DCCI) at its training centre on Wednesday. The Secretary said that not only DCCI but all other chambers and trade associations should also come forward to cater to the training needs of the private sector in order to remove the present deficiency in this field. Most of the sick industries are victim of this deficiency in financial and other management, he said.  
Earlier, welcoming the Secretary Mr Mahbubur Rahman, President, DCCI emphasised that there was no alternative to training and expertise growth for any kind of development and promotional activity. But unfortunately there was an appalling lack of awareness among the businessmen in this regard.  
He mentioned that DCCI

had felt for long this need for training and took initiative to undertake a project.  
Outlining briefly about the projects the President pointed out that DCCI has two technical projects now in operation, one with Geneva-based UN/ITC and the other with the Singapore-based ZDH (German Federation of Small Industries

and Crafts) TA (Technonet Asia) Partnership project.  
In all 18 mid-level executives representing various organisations of the DCCI member-firms participated in the training course. The training was held under the direct guidance and supervision of Dr Rahim B Talukder, Director of IBA of Dhaka University who acted as National Consultant of the DCCI project.

**Two bodies recovered**

Demra police recovered two bodies from different places of Demra upazila Thursday, hospital sources said, reports UNB.  
Police said a diffused body of an unidentified youth was recovered from Muradpur village near the residence of Abed Ali in Demra Upazila in the afternoon.  
Besides, the police recovered the body of a minor boy, Swapan (5).  
Swapan was crushed under the wheels of a running truck near Postagola Bridge Thursday, witnesses said.  
Both the bodies have been brought to the Mitford Hospital for autopsy and separate cases have been lodged.

Among others, Mr Max J Mالدcker, First Secretary and Deputy Head of Mission of the German Embassy, Mr Ganti Narasimhan, UNIDO Country Director at Dhaka and Mr M Azizur Rahman, local expert coordinator of the ZDH/TA project were present and spoke very highly about the initiative taken by the DCCI and assured the DCCI management to extend all kinds of assistance for continuing the training programme so that the DCCI training centre can ultimately turn into a regular business school of the private sector.

**EC mission arrives Oct 20**

A fact finding mission of the European Commission (EC) comes in Dhaka on October 20 to bolster its cooperation with Bangladesh, reports UNB.  
Officials here said Thursday the eight-member team would be led by Gahannes Pitter Pronk, Minister for Development Cooperation of the Netherlands, current Chairman of EC.  
The delegation, condemned "Troika", will include State Minister for Development of Luxembourg G Wholfard and State Minister for Foreign Affairs and Development of Portugal JD Barroso.

Members of the delegation, during their three-day visit, will exchange views with officials on the progress of EC-assisted projects and explore new avenues of cooperation.  
Reconstruction and rehabilitation works in the calamity-ravaged areas of the country will also figure prominently in their discussions, the officials said.

The 12-member EC with its headquarters in Brussels began its active participation in Bangladesh's development efforts in 1986.

**Journalist attacked**

Ragib Hasan, a reporter of the weekly "Protisuti", was attacked and injured by a group of armed miscreants on the Dhaka University campus Tuesday midnight, reports UNB.

The attackers blocked his rickshaw near the Vice-Chancellor's residence while coming to his office at about 11-30 pm and charged for money.

He disclosed his identity as a journalist, but the miscreants rather got angered and hit him on the head with cut-rifles before leaving the spot.

Two other arrested persons are Milon (19) and Mohibul Hassan (20). The arrested persons are suspected of being members of an organised gang involved in mugging, toll collecting and theft, police said.
