

RAJSHAHI, Oct 12: Influx of floating people and beggars in large number from flood-hit rural areas to Rajshahi city has been posing a great problem.

There has been continuous fnflux of beggars from different upazilas of the district. They are coming in large numbers from Charghat, Godagari and Bagha upazilas. Most of these people are victims of the recent floods and river erosion.

Due to acute crisis of food and having no work in flood affected areas hundreds of jobless people with their dependants are pouring into the city in search of work for their sustenance. But failing to get any job many of them including women and children have been
