Employment under the Government of Zimbabwe

Applications are invited for appointment of Engineers and Architects from Bangladeshi nationals for the following Posts under the Government of Zimbabwe. Short listing of candidates will be made by a Preliminary Selection Committee appointed by the Ministry of Works. Final selection will be made by a recruitment team of the Zimbabwean Government from amongst the candidates selected by the Preliminary Selection Committee. Candidates Serving in Government Organisations, Autonomous and Semi-Autonomous bodies and Corporations will have to apply through proper channel and none in the services mentioned above will be eligible to apply if he does not hold a substantive/permanent post with a minimum of 5 years continuous service. Candidates against whom departmental action is pending/under consideration are not eligible to apply.

2. Job particulars under Zimbabwean Govt.

a) ARCHITECTS/SENIOR ARCHITECTS (17 posts)

Salary scale \$21 288 to \$ 35 640 per annum.

Duties: The incumbents will be attached to a team of Architects and technicians engaged in the design, preparation of working drawings and details and supervision of building projects under the leadership of a Principal Architect. Depending upon the applicants experience there is scope for wide range of Professional duties in connection with such projects.

The incumbent will assist in the training of young graduate and architects, technicians and also supervise all aspects of their work.

Qualifications:

Applicants will be professionally qualified architects with 3 to 5 years experience and will hold a degree in Architecture or a member of a recognised Institute of Architects. Subject to proof of relevant post qualification experience the maximum starting salary is \$27 396 per annum.

Age: Not exceeding 35 years.

b) PRINCIPAL ENGINEER : CIVIL — (1 post)

Salary scale : \$37 266 to \$38 292+20% retention allowance.

Duties: The incumbent will be responsible to the Chief Civil and will assist him/her in organising and controlling the Civil Engineering Branch, deputising for the Chief Engineer as and when necessary. The branch is responsible for topographical survey, design and specification of roads, stormwater drainage, sewer and water reticulation schemes and the preparation of bills of quantities and estimates of cost related to same. The incumbent will also assist in the training of young graduate engineers, technicians and also supervise all aspects of their works.

Qualifications:

Applicants will be professionally qualified Civil Engineers with 8 years or more relevant experience and will be members of a recognised Institute of Engineers.

Age: Not exceeding 40 years.

c) PRINCIPAL ENGINEER : ELECTRICAL — (1 post)

Salary scale: \$37 266 to \$38 292+20% retention allowance.

Duties: The incumbent will be responsible to the Chief Engineer Electrical and will assist him/her in organising and controlling the Electrical Engineering Branch, deputising for the Chief Engineer as and when necessary. Responsibilities include the supervision of a staff of Electrical Engineer and technicians, preparation of design and specification of electrical installations required in all government buildings together with site reticulation and preparation of estimates of cost as required. The incumbent will also assist in the training of young graduates engineers and technicians and also supervise all aspects of their work.

Qualifications:

Applicants will be professionally qualified Electrical Engineers with 8 years or more relevant experience and will be members of a recognised Institute of Engineers.

Age: Not exceeding 40 years.

d) DEPUTY PROVINCIAL OFFICER OPERATIONS

(CONSTRUCTION)- (7 posts)

Salary scale \$ 37 266 to \$38 292+20% retention allowance.

Duties: The incumbents will be responsible to the Provincial Officer operations and will deputise in the absence of the Provincial Officer Operations. He/She will be responsible for controlling and directing labour teams for the preparation of estimates, ordering of materials and construction of project on site.

Qualifications:

Applicants will be professionally qualified Architects or Civil Engineers with membership of the relevant professional Institute plus not less than 8 years relevant experience.

Age: Not exceeding 40 years.

e) PRINCIPAL OFFICER OPERATIONS (6 posts)

Salary Scale \$ 40 038 to \$42 372+20% retention allowance.

Duties: The incumbent will be responsible to the Deputy Director Construction and Maintenance. He will represent the Permanent Secretary of Public Construction and National Housing on all matters relating to the province, including advice to the Provincial Governor's office as required. He/She will be responsible for controlling the various activities of the provincial headquarters, depots and sub-depots within the province.

Qualifications:

Applicants will be professionally qualified architects, engineers of quantity surveyors with considerable managerial ability and more than 10 years experience in the construction industry.

Age: Not exceeding 45 years.

f) CHIEF ENGINEER : CIVIL (1 post)

Salary Scale \$40 060 to \$42 372+20% retention allowance.

Duties: The Chief Engineer Civil will be responsible to the Deputy Director Engineering Services for organising and controlling the Civil Engineering Branch of the Ministry which is involved in the design and construction of Civil Engineering Services on Government building sites. He will also be required to act in a consultative capacity for other Government Ministries and Departments.

Qualifications:

Applicants should be professionally qualified engineers or should be of Chartered Civil Engineer or equivalent status with more than 10 years experience in the design of Civil Engineering site service including earthworks, roadworks, sewerage treatment works, sewerage and water reticulation and in the preparation of document for tender and contract administration.

Age: Not exceeding 45 years.

g) PRINCIPAL ARCHITECTS (2 posts)

Salary Scale \$37 266 to \$38 292+20% retention allowance.

Duties: The incumbent will be responsible to the Chief Architect and will assist him/her in organising and controlling one of the four branches. The incumbent will be deputising for the Chief Architect as and when necessary. The incumbents will be attached to a team of Architects and technicians engaged in Architectural design work and the supervision of works on site may be a requirement. The incumbents will also assist in the training of young graduate Architects and technicians and supervise all aspects of their work.

Qualifications:

Applicants will be professionally qualified Architects and be members of a recognised Institute of Architects, and should have more than 8 years experience.

Age: Not exceeding 40 years.

Tribals to launch stir if 22 subjects not transferred

CHITTAGONG, Oct 22 : Chairman of Rangamati Hill District Local Government Parishad Goutam Dewan has demanded immediate transfer of the proposed 22 subjects to the Parishad, reports UNB.

"We'll come down to the street if the government fails to had over the subjects within the tenure of the Parishad. We cannot betray the people of Chittagong Hill Tracts", he said.

Dewan was delivering his presidential speech at a meeting of elected representatives, headmen, 'karbari' as well as military and civil officials at the pourasabha auditorium at Khagrachari on Monday.

He said the parishad came into being after the hill tracts issue was identified as a political problem and everyone should accept this reality and extend all-out cooperation to it.

Dewan made it clear that the present local government

parishad leadership is not greedy for power. "If Shantibahini wants to come back and join the democratic stream, we're ready to accept them heartily."

Dipankar Talukdar MP and Chittagong Area Commander Major General Mahmudul Hasan, former presidential adviser Subimal Dewan, Prishad members Advocate Gyanendu Bikash Chakma and ASM Shahidullah and district BNP General Secretary Zahir Ahmed also spoke on the occasion.

Dipankar Talukdar MP pointed out that the hill tracts problem is a national one ignored by previous parliaments. One national committee was formed and a political step was taken but the unrest continued in the region.

He regretted that the present parliament has taken up many national issues but nothing has been done to solve the hill tracts problem.

"This is our problem. We'll have to solve it ourselves. But, it calls for an environment of trust and confidence", the parliament member said.

General Mahmudul Hasan said the local government parishads were created to ensure the rights of the people of the three hill districts and the present government, having goodwill for these parishads, recently declared that 22 subjects would be transferred to them.

He said some of the Shantibahini activists were learnt to be willing to come back after realising their mistakes. They should be given a chance under the general amnesty declared by the government. He reminded the insurgents that the declaration of amnesty should not be treated as weakness.

General Hasan also attended similar meetings in Khagrachari and Bandarban districts.

Private vessels incur Tk 2.40 cr loss in 2 weeks

Draft level of rivers falls alarmingly

Private sector cargo-coaster owners incurred a loss of Tk 2.40 lakh in last two weeks as their vessels could not sail because of problems of river navigability.

Sources told UNB Tuesday that the coasters could not ply in the Dhaka-Chittagong route from October 11 to 20 as sailors faced difficulties in locating river channels.

Moreover, draft level of rivers lowered alarmingly during the period making operation of the vessels difficult.

Of the officially enlisted 991 private cargo vessels, only four sailed from Chittagong Monday after the river condition improved slightly as result of 'spring tide' which will continue up to October 27. According to official 'tide

table' the draft at Char Chang, popularly known as 'Vellar Char' in Shahabaj river ranged between 3.17 and 2.85 metres during last fortnight. The optimum draft level is 3.65 metres.

According to the tide table, similar navigation problem will occur from October 27 to November 4.

The private cargo vessels usually carry petroleum products, grains, cement and fertilizers from Chittagong and unload the same at Narayanganj.

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA), responsible for maintenance of the channels, have not yet marked new channels for the cargo vessels for the coming dry season, the sources alleged.

DCC contractors asked not to give illegal tolls

Mayor Mirza Abbas Tuesday asked the enlisted contractors of the Dhaka City Corporation not to give any illegal tolls to any quarter, reports BSS.

The mayor was addressing the contractors on the occasion of the commencement of the reconstruction and development works of the city roads.

Mirza Abbas said that ten vigilance teams comprising teachers and students of the Engineering University have been formed to supervise the reconstruction work side by side the corporation officials.

He called upon the contractors to complete the work by maintaining the quality of work.

CMC students observe hunger strike

CHITTAGONG, Oct 22 : Chittagong Medical College Chhatra Parishad Tuesday observed token-hunger strike at the college campus to press home its demand for reopening the college and the situation prevailing in the campus.

Chittagong Medical College was closed a month ago following clashes between rival student groups.

Petroleum dealers

Bangladesh Petroleum Dealers' Association in a statement Tuesday strongly protested reports in a section of newspapers stating oil supply would be stopped from October 28.

The Association President Advocate Abul Kalam Azad issued the statement terming the reports as untrue, and baseless.

DFU office opens

A new office of a recently formed NGO, Development Foundation for the Underprivileged (DFU) was opened Tuesday evening at Dhanmondi.

President of the DFU and an ex-MP Umme Kaoser Salsabeel Hena inaugurated the office. The opening ceremony was also attended by Supreme Court lawyer Abul Kalam Azad, Executive Editor of the weekly Samadhan Jamahuddin Jamal, and executives of the DFU.

Farrukh Smriti Purashkar

Eminent poet, writer, and researcher Abdul Mannan Syed was selected as recipient of this year's Farrukh Memorial Award for his contribution in the field of literature by the Chittagong Sangskritik Kendra.

The award will be handed over to him at a function to be held on November 14 at the Chittagong District Council Auditorium.

Earlier, Syed received Bangla Academy Award, Ajaol Award and Lekhak Shibir Award on literature and research.

Communist League

A meeting of the political bureau of Bangladesh United Communist League was held Tuesday at the party central office here.
