# 2 killed in DU gunbattle

A fierce gunbattle lasting for hours between two rival student groups on the Dhaka University campus yesterday left two students dead and over a dozen others injured. An indefinite curfew was clamped on the campus following the incident. The students killed in the violence are Mirza Galib, an outsider, who had been residing at Mohsin Hall since long and Shaiful Islam Liton, a third year student of the International Relations Department. Both of them JCD activists, were hit by bullets near the Institute of Modern Languages building and died on the spot. Meanwhile, the Dhaka University authority suspended all classes and examinations scheduled to be held today (Monday). The emergency meeting of the Syndicate convened by the Vice-Chancellor could not be held due to curfew. The revised schedule of classes and examinations would be announced later on the basis of development, a DU source said. Police meantime raided a number of residential halls including Jagannath Hall and Shamsunnahar Hall Sunday evening. Heavy contingents of BDR, police and Ansar have been deployed on the campus. Among the injured, the conditions of Mizanur Rahman, a BCL activist and an unidentified street-boy were stated to be critical. Mizan who received injury in his head was under intensive care at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) while the street-boy at the Chest Diseases Hospital, Mohakhali. The other persons who received bullet wounds are Shaiful Islam of the BCL, Gazi Saiful Azam of the JCD, Jafar Sadi Biplob of the BCL, Mizanur Rahman, Hedayetullah, Anisur Rahman and Babu all of the JCD, Mukhtar Hossain, a garments worker and Khokon, a street urchin. Mizanur Rahman, Hedayetullah and Anisur Rahman were admitted to the PG Hospital, Babu at a private clinic and others to the DMCH. Curfew was imposed from 4.30 pm for an indefinite period though students were found moving freely in and around the campus and bringing out processions till 7 pm Sunday. According to campus sources, the armed battle ensued when the associates of Golam Faruq Obhi tried to storm the DUCSU office where the DUCSU General Secretary and Joint Convener of the JCD Khairul Kabir Khokon, Ilias Ali and others were attending organisational matters. JCD activists from their strong holds in Surja Sen Hall and Mohsin Hall being informed of the incident rushed to the spot. The gunbattle soon spread to the adjoining areas of the Arts Building, TSC and central library of the University and continued up to 3.15 pm. The JCD activists took positions at various strategic points near the Arts Building and the Language Institute building with lethal weapons while the BCL activists near Rokeya Hall, TSC and central library of the University. Incessant exchange of gunfire between the two groups forced a large number of students to take shelter in the Arts Building, TSC and central library of the University.

## Stop suicidal acts, political leaders urge BNP, AL

Different political parties and student organisations have expressed grave concern at the armed clash that took place in the Dhaka University campus on Sunday claiming lives of at least two students and demanded judicial enquiry in to the incident, reports BSS. In separate statements, they urged the law-enforcing agencies to bring to book the persons responsible for the clash. They also urged the Prime Minister and Leader of the House Begum Khaleda Zia and Leader of the Opposition in the Jatiya Sangsad Sheikh Hasina to put in their efforts to stop the "suicidal gun fight" between the rival student groups to save the nation from terrorism. ## Govt will work for closer ties with Muslim world: Khaleda

GAZIPUR, Oct 27: Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia said here today that the better understanding that existed among the younger generation would help build a bright future for the Islamic countries in the present day world of conflict and despair, reports BSS. "We have a glorious past, but are now lagging behind because of a period of inaction and slumber," she said adding "I strongly believe what we have done in the past can be done again and our younger generation who are the soldiers of Islam will give the leadership to achieve the objective". The Prime Minister was addressing the fifth convocation for the award of degrees, diplomas and certificates of students and trainees of Islamic Centre for Technical and Vocational Training and Research (ICTVTR) at the Centre's premises. Begum Zia hoped that the students and trainees who received training in the ICTVTR would act as catalysts in the development process and activities of their respective countries. She also hoped that the friendship and fellowship that the young people from different Islamic countries had developed during their training period in the Centre would form a bridge among the younger generation in the Islamic countries. The Prime Minister said Organisation of the Islamic Conference (OIC) which had set up ICTVTR, was functioning for the last 22 years on the basis of consensus. She said, "The unifying factor is our great religion, Islam, our common culture and heritage". "My government will endeavour to further improve our close ties and bond of friendship with the Islamic world", the Prime Minister said. ## Stray bullets from DU campus hit SC building

Bullets from the DU campus hit the Court corridor floor in the afternoon, one barely missing the foot of an advocate there. On Saturday too, stray bullets from the campus area pocked the walls of the accounts section of the Attorney General's office having ruptured two hardboard partitions. Justice THM Habibur Rahman visited the place and ordered the bullets removed from the wall.

## Govt ignores situation in N districts: Hasina

GANGACHHARA (Rangpur), Oct 27: Opposition leader Sheikh Hasina today accused the Awami League government of utter negligence in saving people from what she called starvation and disease in the famine-hit Northern region, reports UNB. "I wonder how this government could ignore the situation and even try to conceal facts that people are facing deaths for want of food and medicine", she said. Hasina, President of Awami League, accused the ruling party of misappropriating and politicising relief operations. The opposition leader was addressing a dozen of unscheduled gatherings of people in remote villages and unions of Gangachhara and Pirgachha upazilas on the third day of her visit to Northern region. She visited Kolkand, Burihat, Barobeel, Baikanda, Alambittor, Parul and Nauhali to see the condition of the people in the worst affected areas. The Awami League chief opened gruel kitchens at Barobeel primary school in Barobeel union, Borobari primary school in Alambittor union of Gangachhara upazila and another at Rangpur town hall and distributed cooked food among the destitute. Thousands of rural men, women and children, looking famished, were seen rushing to Hasina and telling her about their tales of woe. Addressing a rally at the premises of Parul primary school in Pirgachha upazila in the evening, Hasina said "we do not want to go to Parliament if we are not allowed to speak about the misery of the distressed people.... we were elected to talk about their problems and realise See Page 12 Col. 8

## Press Note on DU killings

Two students of Chhatra Dal were killed and 10 others injured when a group of armed workers of Chhatra League attacked the Chhatra Dal workers and leaders at DUCSU office in Dhaka on Sunday afternoon, a Press Note issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs said on Sunday night, reports BSS. The students killed were identified as Mirza Galibur Rahman and Liton of Chhatra Dal. Of the injured persons, three were released after first aid, the Press Note said. Following is the text of the Press Note: "A group of armed students of the Chhatra League, which killed Dr. Milton, suddenly attacked the students of Chhatra Dal at the DUCSU office this afternoon when the DUCSU General Secretary Khairul Kabir Khokon of Chhatra Dal and other Chhatra Dal leaders were inside the See Page 12 Col. 8

## Heated debate in JS on N region situation Opposition calls it grave, Govt says 'No'

By Staff Correspondent Opposition Sheikh Hasina who is now visiting Rangpur did not turn up yesterday till the beginning of the debate. Later the house decided to initiate the discussion on the issue at 9 pm for an hour and adjourned the discussion till today. Speaker Sheikh Rezaul Karim has convened a meeting of the Business Executive Committee today at 10.30 am at his chamber to decide the time frame for continuation of discussion today. The discussion was participated by treasury bench members Fazlur Rahman Patal and Abu Youssuf Md Khalilur Rahman while from the opposition the Awami League MP Abdur Rouf, Jamaat MP Latifur Rahman and Jatiya Party MP Shah Moazzem Hossain. Abdur Rouf said that there was serious famine in the northern part of the country and the BNP government had miserably failed to control the situation. He said that in the Nilfamar district alone, a total of 526 persons died during last few weeks by eating inedible food. He demanded of the government to declare the northern area as a 'disaster zone' and take adequate relief measures to save the situation from further deterioration. Jamaat MP Latifur Rahman said that during his visit to the area he found people were half-fed or unfed. In Chapainawabganj alone, about 528 people died of diarrhoea, he claimed. He demanded of the government massive test relief work and distribution of clothes so that the people could be saved from the cold during winter. Abu Youssuf Mohammad Khalilur Rahman taking floor said that there was no question of dying from starvation in the northern region. Test relief work was going on in full swing in different See Page 12 Col. 5
