



# Spring date likely for Tyson bout

LOS ANGELES, Nov 5 : The postponed world heavyweight title clash between champion Evander Holyfield and former title holder Mike Tyson could take place next spring, reports

Holyfield's manger Dan Duva has predicted that the showdown, originally scheduled for November 8 but cancelled after Tyson injured himself in training, could go ahead in March.

"I think there's better than even chance the fight will happen in March or April," he

Referring to Tyson's January trial on rape charges, Duva went on: "I believe there will be a trial delay. Very rarely do trials start on time... My feeling is that Mike's trial will not start on Jan. 27 and that we will have a chance to put it together again."

Holyfield, meanwhile, will face late substitute opponent Francesco Damiani of Italy in Atlanta on November 23 staking his World Boxing Association (WBA), and International Boxing Federation (IBF) titles.

The World Boxing Council (WBC) has refused to recognise the fight because Damiani does not feature in their 'top-ten'.

If Holyfield is beaten by Damiani, the WBC crown will become vacant.

# Bugner's son set to make pro debut

MIL ON KEYNES, England, Nov 5 : Joe Bugner Junior will make his professional boxing debut here next week, reports

At six feet six inches and more than 16 stone, the 21year-old will be larger than father Joe was at the start of a career which took him to a world heavyweight title challenge against Muhammad Ali.

The son of the former British, European and Commonwealth champion will be managed by Andy Smith, the same man as his father, for a six-round fight against David Jules on November 12.

# Niaz earns gold

Tojo, who returned home yesterday with the team, also said, Bangladesh finished joint third in the nine-day competition with Indonesia bagging an equal number of 21 points.

part in the championship in which China won the title and the Philippines finished runners-up.

Bangladesh was placed ninth in the earlier championship.

China clinched the title while the Philippine became runners-up.

# ROK eye 12 golds in Barcelona

SEOUL, Nov 5: South Korea aims to capture 12 gold medals and place 10th in the 1992 Summer Olympics, top sports officials said Tuesday, reports AP.

Sports and Youth Minister Park Chul-un and Korea Amateur Sports Association President Kim Jong-yol reported to President Roh Tae-Woo that all sports organizations will be put under a special Olympic system beginning Wednesday for efforts to meet

the target. South Korea won 12 gold medals and ranked fourth in the 1988 Seoul Olympics, after the Soviet Union, East Germany and the United States.

Park said he expected the United States, Western Europe and China to perform strongly in the 1992 Olympics, with Soviet and East European athletic fortunes declining in the

wake of political upheavals.

# SA delays decision on an Olympic return

JOHANNESBURG, Nov 5 : Sports administrators reached a decision Sunday on whether to send a South African team to the 1992 Olympic gamesbut refused to announce it reports AP. All signals suggest South

Barcelona, Apain, after a 32-

year absence because of it apartheid policies. But Sam Ramsamy, head of the National Olympic Committee of South Africa, said the decision would not be

made public until Wednesday. "We had a very, very fruitful meeting," Ramsamy told journalists following a day of talks among committee members and other top sports officials, "We have to wait until the sixth of November when the decision will be announced."

Ramsamy, who for years led the international sports boycott against South Africa, now favors accepting the invitation from the International Olympic Committee.

Most leading anti-apartheid groups, including the African national Congress, also say they would support sénding an in# tegrated South African squad to the Games.
