India's strength today lies in a formidable batting lineup, one of the strongest in the world. With the batsmen in great form, chasing a target against South Africa may be cricket. more a question of tempera-

ment and nerves. South Africa returns to international cricket after a 21year absence when it plays three 50-over one-day internationals against India beginning Sunday in the eastern port city

of Calcutta. India, a nation of 844 million people, is crazy about cricket, a game bought to this Asian nation by the British who ruled the subcontinent for

more than 200 years. The British left in 1947, but the legacy that they left is not only a national cricket passion out also a money spinner.

What is worrying the Indian side is that most of the 14 members of the South African team are totally unknown to Indian players. "We know Allan Doland is

South Africa's quickest bowler," said Navin Kohli, a cricket The visiting team's strength

from four all-rounders and five specialist batsmen. The Indian team is lopsided with emphasis on batting.

Sachin Tendulkar, an 18year-old Indian batsman, has emerged as one of international cricket's most exciting

"It's stupied beyond words, I have never heard anything so exaggerated, it's a total fantasy," Phil Coles, secretarygeneral of the Australian Olympic Committee (AOC) told Reuters on Wednesday. Coles and Australia's other member, London-based busi-

tions in the hands of lawyers for possible legal action. Gosper said in London on Tuesday the allegations were untrue and 'outrageously libel-

nessman Kevan Gosper, said

Der Spiegel did not identify Coles or Gosper in its report.
