All labourers reported missing by co-workers after the accident were later accounted for, according to a supervisor of the sub-contractor who hired the labourers for the earthwork at the site.

Prompt action enabled the Fire Service personnel to rescue the seven labourers trapped in the debris coming out of the broken sewerage line and resulting in the mudslide. All of the injured were taken to DMCH where five were released after first-aid treatment while the other two were admitted at the hospital, DMCH sources said.

The two labourers admitted were identified as Monohor (38) and Ibrahim (35). They were both released from the hospital today but were again admitted in a private clinic for further treatment by the contractors implementing the project.

Measures to repair and stop the leakage from the damaged sewerage line were undertaken Thursday. Concrete pipes will be used to replace the broken portion of the sewerage line. Earthwork at the site cannot be resumed unless the leakage is stopped and the water is pumped out of the drain, WASA officials said.
