#### Future of cotton mill workers uncertain

Nov. 20: The future of thousands of workers of Sirajganj Spinning and Cotton Mill has become uncertain while the owners latest attempt to sell out the mills ended in failure, reports UNB.

The attempt failed as the buyers set certain conditions including retrenchment of surplus workers and fresh appointment which the workers opposed.

The Mills had been laid off on November 17, last year without any prior notification on grounds of financial loss.

Earlier, the Mill authorities borrowed about Tk. 18 crore for balancing and modernisation but diverted the money to other projects, the mill workers alleged.

The authorities also have withdrew Tk. 58 lakh from the provident fund account of the workers in collaboration with some of the union leaders. they further alleged.

The local unit of the Sramik Karmachari Oikya Parishad observed programmes including hartal to reopen the mill, but the mill still remains closed and the workers without job.

SYLHET, Nov 20: The Habiganj town electricity distribution project is now threatened with abandonment due to non-cooperation and obstacles created by the Habigani Pourashava and Roads and Highways Department. The Asian Development Bank (ADB), sponsor of the project has warned that the project might be declared, abandoned if the scheduled works are not completed by this month (November), it is reported.

It may be mentioned here that, the 25 crore Taka project was started with the assistance from ADB under the "14 town Electricity Supply Project". Under the project, construction of a 33/11 KV sub-station has already been completed by a Chinese firm.

In the second phase, extension works of new distribution line from the sub-station through new poles have been going on. Old poles are now being replaced by the new ones. The pourashava and the
