

#### Hundreds killed in Mogadishu fighting Ali Mahdi, 52, was named Stad Barre was ousted. An es-

NAIROBI, Nov 21 : Forces loyal to Somalia's President Ali Mahdi Mohamed on Thursday clashed in the East African nation's capital for a fifth day with supporters of a rival clan leader, reports AP.

The workers said that hundreds have died in the conflict between forces of Gen. Mohamed Farrah Aidid, chairman of the ruling United Somali Congress, and those of the President.

Aidid elaimed that he ousted Alt Mahdt on Monday, one day after the conflict erupted. The President's forces, however, continue to resist from their stronghold in the city's north, according to the sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

"The situation is appalling." said Brigitte Meng, of the International Committee of the Red Cross. "The hospitals are overcrowded, overwhelmed, with wounded.\* Aid sources said the situa-

tion could deteriorate further into open civil war, as other large clans were beginning to ally themselves with one side or the other.

The conflict is essentially clanbased, with Aidid and Ali Mahdi representing different factions of the country's large, central Hawtiye clan from which the ruling party draws its strength.

Aidid, of the Habar Gedir group, has long resented that Alt Mahdi, of the Abgal group, holds the presidency. All Mahdi, in turn, has been trying to have Aidid removed as party
