Presided over by Sagir Ahmed, the rally was addressed among others by Shibli Chowdhury, Mohammad Ishaq, Abu Rashid Mantu and Imran Hossain Patoari.

The JCD leaders alleged that the Awami League-backed BCL workers were creating anarchy in the college compound after reopening the college.

They urged the opposition leader Sheikh Hasina to expel armed activists from the BCL and said that only suspension of party activities would not restore peace on the campuses.

The Jagannath University College which was closed on June 15 following a bloody clash between JCD and BCL (S-A), resumed on Monday.

Jatiyatabadi Ulema Dal floated

The ruling BNP Wednesday floated a new front organisation — Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Ulema Dal, reports UNB.

Party Secretary General and LGRD Minister Abdus Salam Talukder approved of the Ulema Dal as Bangladesh Nationalist Party's Ulema wing on Tuesday when a delegation of the organisation met him, said a BNP press release.

A 151-member Central Convening Committee of the Ulema Dal has been reconstituted with Alhaj Matulana Ruhul Ameen and Alhaj Muhammad Moazzem Hossain as Convener and Joint Convener respectively.

Maulana Rafiqul Islam Armani and Maulana Qari Muhammad Golam Mostafa are member-secretaries of the committee.

Besides, a three-member Advisory Committee of the Ulema Dal has been formed. It consists of State Minister for Religious Affairs Prof MA Mannan, Deputy Minister for Shipping AMB Zahidul Haq and Relief and Rehabilitation Secretary of BNP Central Committee NI Khan.

Mid-term rolling plan to help pull economy out of stagnation

A high level meeting between the government of Bangladesh and the members of Local Consultative Group (LCG) Thursday discussed medium term development programme which is also known as three years rolling programme, reports UNB.

The meeting held at the NEC conference room of Planning Commission was presided over by Planning Minister Zahiruddin Khan, says an official handout.

Ambassador, High Commissioner and representatives of other countries belonging to the aid group, chiefs of local mission of the World Bank, International Monetary Fund,

USAID and Asian Development Bank participated in the discussion.

Addressing the meeting Zahiruddin Khan said the government was currently busy implementing an economic programme to lift the economy out of the present state of stagnation and a three-year rolling investment programme has been drawn up in this connection.

Referring to the country's potentials in the agriculture and export oriented industries, he said, the government has set up a policy frame work to direct private initiative in this direction.

The rolling plan will support this process by expediting

building up of appropriate infrastructure, he added.

The High Commissioner of Canada, ambassador of the Netherlands, Director of USAID and Representatives of Japan, Switzerland and World Food Programme congratulated the government for drawing up of a medium term rolling plan.

ERD Secretary Enam Ahmed Chowdhury, Planning Secretary Syed Ahmed and members of Planning Commission Nasim Uddin and Dr Maqsood Ali Khan also addressed the meeting. Secretaries of the concerned ministries also participated in the discussion.

Call to create awareness against AIDS

Prof A G M Badruddoza Chowdhury, President of the National Anti-Tuberculosis Association of Bangladesh (NATAB) said in Dhaka Thursday that the best way to keep the nation off the curse of AIDS was to create mass awareness about the HIV virus and the consequent fatality of the afflicted cases.

"It is a curse that has befallen many of the countries of the world today," Prof Chowdhury, who is the Deputy Leader of the House in Parliament told BSS on return from a week-long conference on AIDS incidence on Tuberculosis patients in Paris.

The conference organised by the International Union Against Tuberculosis and Lung Diseases (IUATLD) was also attended by Prof LUC Montagnier, a French researcher who discovered AIDS virus. Prof Montagnier read out a paper on the cumulative effects of AIDS and Tuberculosis on a patient.

Prof Chowdhury who is a physician of high repute said that almost twenty percent of

the Africans had been carrying AIDS virus and the programme to contain this scourge had been gaining momentum in these countries. He said that in the western countries the programme against AIDS had attained a level of social movement.

Possible sources of contamination of the virus among others are multiple use of syringe, transfusion of blood, secretion of female semens during sex.

Prof Chowdhury asked the NATAB office bearers who gathered at the Airport to receive him to organise a mass campaign to create public awareness against the danger of AIDS. He said that the physicians should also update their knowledge about the AIDS and venereal diseases. He said that Hepatitis-B is also a major health hazard. Our people should be educated about this disease as well.

The other members of the Bangladesh delegation to the conference is Dr Sakhawat Hossain, Secretary General of NATAB.

'Management crisis causes loss in different sectors'

The accusation is described below.

Description of accusation
