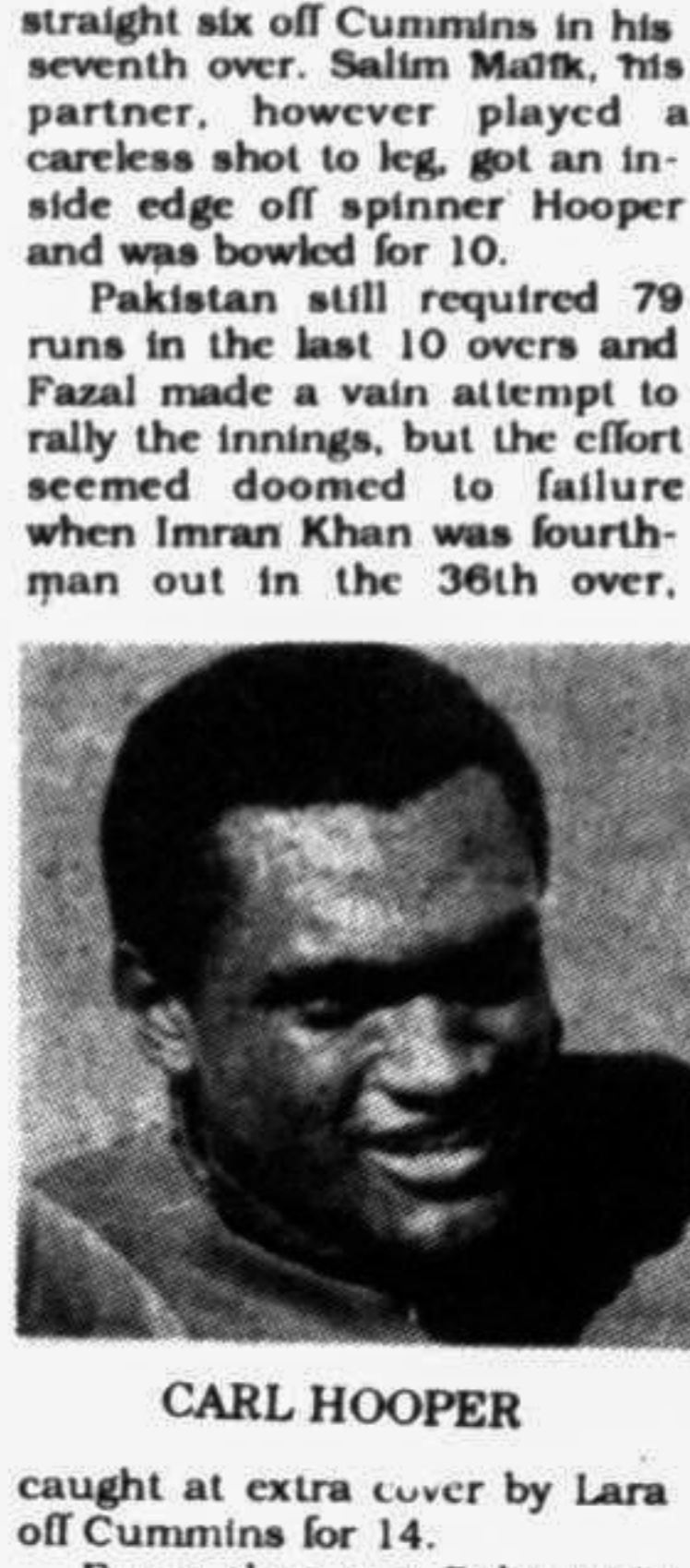

Women's W Cup wide open

CANTON, Nov 24: The quarterfinals of the first FIFA world women's soccer championship open Sunday, and all but one of the eight survivors have a good shot at the title, reports AP.

Germany and Denmark will meet in Zhongshan to open the day's action. Later, host China will face Sweden at Tianhe Stadium in Canton, Norway and Italy tangle in Jiangmen, and the United States meets Taiwan in Foshan.

Sweden, which lost to the United States 3-2 in the Group B opener a week ago, received an unlucky break by drawing a match with the host in the stadium where 60,000 fans watched China rout Norway 4-0 in the tournament opener.
