Abahani Krira Chakra ended a three-year title brought when they dethroned defending cham

pions Dhaka Mohammedan Sporting Club by seven runs in yesterday's close final of the Damal Summer cricket tournament at the Dhaka

Put in to bat, Abahani mustered a modest 163 before being all out in the 44th of their 45-overs quota. In reply. Mohammedans finished on 156 before losing their last wicket to the last delivery of their 44th over to leave their arch rivals the winners by the close margin of seven runs.

The more than 25,000 fans who had flocked to the Dhaka Stadium - a record attendance for any domestic matchwere treated to a rather anticlimatic finale to the 13th version of the tournament named after former Bangladesh Crieket Control Board vice president and selector Dr Mazharul Islam Damal who died in 1979. The two protagonists on the day- arch-rivals chasing horiours in the country's sporting arena- failed to produce any noteworthy performance that the large crowd could savour in days to come. Despite the ideal setting for the game pitting the two strongest club sides of the country, both possessing some outstanding individual performers, neither side appeared to have dominated the proceedings. It was just a question of luck, in the end, with Abahani the luckier of the two teams.

The batting, bowling, fielding lacked the touch of quality that one might have expected from such a crucial and prestige encounter. 

That familiarity, as well as those differences, take the stage Saturday night when the United States plays Norway in the final game of the first FIFA world women's champi-

"They know us very well, and we know them very well," said Norway midfielder Brithe Hegstad, who played collegiately at North Carolina. "I think we have an advantage in

that we play in a national women's league, about 40 games a year, and they don't have that. But they're a very good team, and they have a

great coach." The US coach is Anson Dorrance, also Hegstad's coach at North Carolina. They Tar Heels have won nine NCAA women's titles and have nine

players on the US team. The United States and Norway have played seven times, with Norway leading the series 4-3. At the 1988 FIFA invitational tournament in China, Norway beat the United States 1-0 in the quarterfinals on an own goal and went on to win the championship.

In 1990, the United States beat Norway 4-0 and 4-2 in an exhibition tournament in Canada. Those defeats spurred Norwegian coach Even Pellerud to revise his training methods.

"We got a shock last year with their speed, so we worked very hard to close that gap," Pellerud said. "We have developed by training with men and playing with men, when our teams are together, once a week. And we had to develop out playing ability, under pressure because the speed in the Norwegian league is bad."

Norway started out the FIFA tournament with a 4-0 loss to China before rebounding with four straight victories, including a 4-1 decision over Sweden in the semifinals Wednesday.
