Railway engine mended without foreign aid

A railway engine seriously damaged in an accident, was put into operation again Saturday after making necessary repair works by local engineers and employees by utilising local technology, an official source said in Dhaka, reports BSS.

This is for the first time that a railway engine has been repaired and rehabilitated without foreign technical assistance, the source said.

Inaugurating the re-operation of the newly repaired engine at Kamalapur railway workshop in the city the same day Communications Minister Oli Ahmad directed the railway officials, engineers and employees to repair other damaged engines within the next three months.

Electric traffic signal system in Rajshahi soon

RAJSHAHI, Dec 7: Rajshahi City Corporation (RCC) will introduce electric traffic signal system in all important roads at a cost of about Taka one core in the current fiscal year. reports BSS.

Mizanur Rahman Minu, Mayor Rajshahi City Corporation addressing a press conference Thursday said the corporation will spend over Taka six crore for implementing about three hundred development projects. 151 acres acquired for garbage disposal

Tk 25 crore city drainage development plan taken up

Dhaka City Corporation has undertaken road and drainage development programme at a cost of taka 25 crore during the current year.

Talking to BSS at his office Saturday, city Mayor Mirza Abbas said two-thirds of the road network in the city covering a length of about 2250 km. need quick development and completion of the same would require between Taka 100 and 125 crore.

He said as the Corporation was facing resource constraints, the development of city mads would have to be implemented in phases.

Mirza Abbas said, the Corporation would also start repair and development of 1500 kms of damaged and choked drains on priority basis to help improve the civic facil-

The Mayor said, though there are provisions for about

60,000 bulbs on the city streets, about 15,000 bulbs were in order when BNP government took over. Twenty thousand fused street bulbs had already been replaced and the rest would be replaced gradually, he said.

"Asked how the Corporation had increased its budget allocation for the roads, the Mayor said," we sought an additional Taka 15 crore fund from the government in view of the pitiable condition of the city roads. We will seek more funds from the government to provide minimum civic amenities to the ever increasing city

Mirza Abbas said, the Corporation would receive Taka six crore from Asian Development Bank (ADB) for roads and improvement of drainage system.

The Corporation has already

floated tender for procurement of 20 modern lorries for garbage disposal with World Bank assistance as part of its environment improvement project, Abbas said.

A total of 151 acres have been acquired in Matuatl. Demra. for garbage disposal.

The Mayor said, the Corporation will undertake sanitary sand pilling at the site to prevent spread of stinky smell in order to avoid atmospheric pollution.

Asked if the Corporation was contemplating any other ambitious plan to increase civic amenities, the Mayor said, 'we have a plan for construction of some fly-overs at busy crossings to ease traffic

The corporation has leased out its public toilets through open bid for their better maintenance, he added.

AL didn't want to declare independence, says minister

Speakers at a discussion meeting Saturday recalled the contribution of late President Ziaur Rahman and called upon the people to materialise his dreams for a happy and prosperous Bangladesh, reports

Speaking at a publication ceremony of a book titled "Ziaur Rahman Sharak Grantha" (Memorial book on Ziaur Rahman) at the Institution of Engineers' auditorium in Dhaka afternoon, they also called for institutionalizing the hard-earned

democracy. State Minister for Cultural Affairs Prof Jahanara Begum chaired the function organised by Suchana Shahitya O Sangskritik Sangshad, a cultural organisation.

Environment, Forest, Livestock and Fisheries Minister Abdullah Al Noman. Prof Emazuddin Ahmed of Dhaka University, Dhaka University Teachers' Association President Prof. Anwarullah Chowdhury, BFUJ (Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists) President Reazuddin Ahmed, journalist Gtas Kamal Chowdhury, poet Al Mujahidi and editor of the book Ruhul Amin spoke on the occasion.

Referring to the declaration of independence in 1971 by late President Ziaur Rahman. Abdullah Al Noman said despite being a soldier he (Zia) had made a fundamental contribution to the country's poli-

200 Rohingyas enter into Bangladesh every day

The 'Rohingya Solidarity Organisation' of Arakan (Burma) has urged the Islamic heads of government to raise the issue of Myanmar (Burmese) Muslim refugees in the coming Islamic summit in Dakar, capital of Senegal, reports BSS.

In a statement, Dr Mohammad Yunus, president of the organisation, said Muslims from Myanmar continue to pour into Bangladesh at the rate of 150-200 persons every day due to repression of

the "Myanmar authorities". The influx continues despite understanding reached between Bangladesh and Burma during Foreign Minister A S M Mustafizur Rahman's visit to that country for an end

to the exodus. The organisation appealed to the Islamic leaders to raise the issue at the summit, beginning December 9 and adopt appropriate resolutions for a lasting solution to the problem

of Myanmar Muslim refugees. The statement was sent also to Secretary General of the Organisation of Islamie Conference Dr Hamid Al Gabid.

BSCIC to monitor credits for small industries

Credit programme for small and cottage industries of banks. and financial institutions will regularly be monitored by Bangladesh Small and Cottage Industries Corporation (BSCIC), reports BSS.
