To say that Begum Rokeya was a pioneer for the emancipation of women would be a gross dilution of her greatness. She was not only a champion for women but for anyone male or female who fell under the category of the underprivileged, the underdog and the oppressed. Being a powerful literary figure in her own right her insightful assessment of the social, economic and psychological problems of society indicates a woman way ahead of her

time. The open air forum organized by Nari Pakhha' at the Public Library on December 9th introduced us to Rokeya's intellectual dynamism and sensitivity to the sufferings of hu-

In the passages read out from one of her earliest essays, Begum Rokeya expresses her insatiable thirst for knowledge and her need to understand the world around her. In this excerpt she tries to create an awareness of the fact that ignorance is the greatest obstacle for women in their struggle for equal rights. In Greeha, another essay, Rokeya recognizes the unhappiness and discontent of most housewives of her time whose homes were like prisons that seemed to stifle their very souls. She points out that women are not educated to be equal to their husbands -"cooking, sewing and reading a few novels" being all the education

required of them. It is a pity that even today a woman with a college degree has a high rating in the marriage market — as long as it is a lower degree than what her perspective groom




