### Profiles of new units for disinvestment completed

The ECNEC sub-committee on disinvestment of public enterprises has completed the profiles of the industries to be sold at the first phase under fresh disinvestment programme.

Sources said those units which are running profitably or can easily be made viable will be privatised in the first phase. Others will undergo rigorous reforms before disinvestment. A total of 42 units will be disinvested in this phase.

Authorities have already engaged chartered accountant firms for apprisal of the units. Sources said the sub-committee has also worked out modalities for disinvestment of the units.

Meanwhile, three meetings of the sub-committee were held and a fourth, the final one will be held early in the next week to sort out the remaining issues on the modalities. The draft modalities will then be sent to ECNEC for its decision.

The process of disinvestment will begin on full-scale after getting the go-ahead from

So far, about 572 units have been privatised since the disinvestment process began in 1976. Of these, 497 units were disinvested from the Ministry of Industry, 35 units from the textile sector and 40 units from the jute sector.

Sources said out of the 497 units disinvested by the Industry Ministry payment for 420 units were completed. The payment for the rest 77 units were partially made.

### Demand for more Bangladeshi goods

Importers from five countries have recently expressed their willingness to buy different kinds of manufactured goods from Bangladesh.

# Japanese experts outline key factors for garment market

Strict maintenance of quality, timely shipment and supplying consumers with correct information on apparel products are the key to achieving international market for any country, three Japanese experts told a seminar in Dhaka Thursday, reports BSS.

"Poor quality, late delivery and misinformation about goods not only result in a noconfidence in the manufacturing nation but also threaten the survivable of its apparel industry, said the Japanese experts while dwelling on different aspects of the industry during the business session of the seminar titled "Apparel Market in Japan."

Jointly organised by the Japan External Trade Organisation (JETRO) and the Export Promotion Bureau (EPB) in cooperation with the Bangladesh Garments Manufactures and Exporters Association (BGMEA), the inaugural ceremoney was attended by Hajime Kitaoka, First Secretary at the embassy of Japan as the guest, and Moshaffaf Hossain, President of BGMEA as the special guest. Nayoyshi Noguchi, JETRO representative in Bangladesh and Chairman of the organising committee for the seminar gave the welcome speech while Imran A Khan Lodi, A

JETRO official conducted it. The day-long seminar, held a city hotel, was participated by about 60 owners of garment factories.

The experts said, according to 1988 statistics, Japan had imported garments worth more than 80 billion US dollars for the year from the Newly Industrialised Countries (NICs) like South Korea, China, Hong Kong and some other Asian nations.

The leader of the three member experts team, Yasuhiro Shoda, said there was

bright prospect for Bangladesh garments provided consistent efforts were made both by the entrepreneurs and the employees to further improve the quality of products.

Hajime Kitaoka, in his short speech, said the government of Japan gives special importance to Bangladesh because of its geographical location between the south and the east in this region.

He said the Japanese assistance to garments sector would be more generous and this seminar would help to that end as both the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Japanese Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) were involved

Recalling his experience during a recent visit to a garment factory in Chittagong, Kotaoka said he saw beautiful coordination between the Bangladesh workers and the Japanese management there.

Bangladesh, according to official statistics, has carned

Taka 1315.30 crore in foreign exchange during the last five months of the current financial year, the target being Taka 4000 erore for the current fis-

During the last fiscal the country carned Taka 3000 crore from this sector, which employs about four and a half lakh people, 85 per cent of them women.

Naoyoshi Noguchi said JETRO, since its functioning in Dhaka in 1973, had been making sincere efforts for promotion of trade between Japan and other countries, specially the developing ones.

He said JETRO activities were now concentrated on Japan's import from Bangladesh by assisting it to develop its quality of products in order to reduce the huge trade gap between Dhaka and Tokyo.

Noguchi said his organisation was also promoting Japanese investment to accelcrate the industrial develop-
