Ctg Port traffic volume falls

CHITTAGONG, Dec 22: Traffic volume through Chittagong Port during the past five months recorded a fall by about nine lakh metric tons compared to the corresponding period of the last fiscal.

According to official reports, cargoes handled from July through November, 91-92 totalled at 25,97,337 MT while the volume was 34,98,476 MT during the same period of 90-91.

Of the total volume handled during the past five months imports accounted for 22,57,566 MT and exports 3,29,771 MT while during the same period of 90-91 30,54,245 MT of import goods and 4,44,231 MT of export goods were handled, official reports said.

The number of total vessels called at the Port during the past five months was 385 against 439 vessels in the same period of the last fiscal

Dr Abdur Rahim BARC Director of Nutrition, told UNB that BARC set up 100 demonstration plots, each covering 400 square feet in every

upazila for two terms (1988-89 and 1989-90) to produce vegetable round the year.

BARC, which sponsored the programme to ensure 162 gram vegetables per head daily, had supplied necessary inputs to the farmers for the implementation of the programme.
