Agitating BBA students lock administrative, academic buildings

Students of Bachelor of **Business Administration** (BBA) department at Hajee Danesh Science and Technology University (HSTU) yesterday locked administrative and academic buildings demanding introduction of major subjects of the discipline.

Sources said, at least 250 people including the vice chancellor, his teachers, officials and staffs were confined to two buildings as the agitating students all of a sudden put them under lock and key around 3:30pm.

Sources said, the students of the BBA faculty came in a procession in front of the administrative building chanting various

slogans.

Half an hour later, about 150 students of second and first year BBA locked the entrances to the buildings in a bid to press home their demand.

Rajesh Biswas of BBA department told this correspondent that they would go for a fast unto death programme if their demand is not met by the authorities.

The teachers of the alleged. university yesterday urged the agitating students to cancel their programme but to no effect.

Printing press gutted

Fire gutted a printing press and a motorbike showroom damaging goods worth Tk 20 lakh in the district town on Monday morning, said firefighters. Locals and fire service sources said the fire originated from an electric short circuit at Saroda Printing Press and Stationery at about 9:10am and soon the flame engulfed the nearby showroom of Indian TVS motorcycle. On information, firefighters from Kurigram rushed to the spot and doused the flame after one and half hours of hectic efforts. The blaze burnt a printing machine, two computers and stationary papers.

Land dispute kills one

A man was killed and two others were injured allegedly by rivals over a land dispute at Burgaon village in Tarail upazila yesterday morning. The deceased was identified as Habibur Rahman alias Habul Mia, 50, son of late Matiur Rahman of the village. Police said there was a longstanding dispute between the victim and one Abu Mia over control of a land at the village. Habul along with his two younger brothers Harun Mia, 40, and Tara Mia, 35, came under attack by the suporters of Abu Mia when the three went to the land to dig at about 8:00pm. They hit Hablu with a spade, leaving him dead on the spot. Harun Mia and Tara were rushed to Tarail upazila health complex in critical condition.

BNP stages protest

Youth murdered

A youth was killed and another injured by criminals at Ramasharpur Bazar in Gabtoli upazila yesterday morning. The victim is Bipul, 18, of the bazar area. Abdul Rashid, officer in-charge of Gabtoli police station, said a transgender person harassed one Mukul, 17, near a shop in the area on Monday evening sexually. Following the incident, Bipul and Swapon, 25, rushed to the spot and locked in a clash with the gang. At one stage, the attackers stabbed the duo, leaving them injured seriously. The youths were rushed to Ziaur Rahman Medical Collage and Hospital where Bipul died at about 6:00am, the OC added.

Illegal notebooks flood Barisal, Khulna markets agree to relax

Illegal notebooks and guidebooks, printed by some unscrupulous publishers, have flooded the markets in Barisal and Khulna districts.

According to our Barisal correspondent, notebooks and guidebooks are being sold openly in the city and different upazilas of the district. Bookshops at Sadar Road, Girza Moholla, Parara Road, Line Road, Anami Lane, and Band Road in the city are selling the banned books.

A mobile court led by Magistrate Shahinuzzaman yesterday conducted a drive in Sadar Road area, seized some banned note and guidebooks from two shops and fined the owners Tk3,000 each.

Sensing the presence of law enforcers, the owners and employees of other shops fled the area, keeping shutters down.

District administration sources said

upazilas markets to stop selling the banned notebooks and guidebooks.

Some guardians held private coaching centres responsible for encouraging the students to buy notebooks and guidebooks. They said the bookstores are selling the banned books at much higher rates.

A bookseller in the city, requesting anonymity said notebooks and guidebooks were printed, giving false addresses of printers and publishers. "I have been selling the banned books since the beginning of the New Year," he added.

"Notebooks and guidebooks are still in high demand. We sell the books for high prices to cover business risk," said another bookseller at Sadar Road in the city.

In Khulna, banned notebooks and guidebooks are being sold in the city and upazilas, reports UNB.

Almost all bookshops in the city and

banned notebooks and guidebooks secretly published by a section of unscrupulous publishers, guardians alleged.

Besides, the textbooks meant for

free distribution among the secondary and primary level students are also being sold on the markets. The sellers are giving the books only to their known customers. A notebook seller, keeping his iden-

tity secret, said he has been selling the banned books and textbooks since the beginning of the New Year. A number of publishers printed the

textbooks secretly and selling those on the markets. Those deprived of getting textbooks are being deceived after buying the printed books of the companies.

Contacted, TM Zakir Hossain, deputy director of secondary and higher education of Khulna region, said sale and marketing of notebooks and drive will continue in the city and different upazilas are selling the guidebooks are banned.

The vessel owners said each of the 13 triple-deck launches has capacity to carry 760-1220 passengers (including 20-25 percent cabin and sofa seats) and at least 4500-5000 passengers per day is required to run six launches from each end.

Saidur Rahman Rintu, vice president of the launch owners association, claimed that total number of passengers never exceed 2500 from each end on normal days although there is rush of cabin passengers on the route every weekend and holidays.
