### Candidates need to show sources of fund in 7 days

Candidates for the February 27 parliamentary elections will be required to submit a statement within seven days from today with a disclosure of the probable source of fund to meet the election expenses. The highest amount of expenditure has been limited to Taka three by the Election

Commission. The Election Commission recently amended the Representation of the People Order, 1972 making it mandaelection expenditure with seven days from the date of withdrawal of nomination papers. The withdrawal of nomination papers expires today.

The procedures of keeping

the accounts have been stated in the Government Gazette published on January 14. According to this provision, an election agent shall duly keep and maintain a register of receipts and expenditures in prescribed form. The election agent shall within 15 days, after the publication of the name of the returned candidate, under Article 19 or Article 39, submit to the Returning Officer an account of election expenses giving the account of personal expenditory for every contesting candi- ture. All vouchers shall be kept date to submit the return of with the account of election expenses arranged according to the date of payment and serially numbered. Such serial number

shall be entered in the appro-

priate column of the relevant

### Thousands of marchers demand Gorbachev's resignation

MOSCOW, Jan 20: Hundreds of thousands of Soviets rallied in the heart of Moscow on Sunday to protest the government's bloody crackdown on Lithuania and demand President Mikhail S. Grobachev's resignation.

The crowd that marched to the Manezh Square in sight of the Kremlin was accompanied by a sea of yellow, red and green Lithuanian flags, red. white and blue Russian flags and banners denouncing Gorbachev and military leaders for the assault on the Lithuanian broadcast centre a week ago that left 14 people

dead. A message from Russian Federation President Boris N. Yeltsin, Gorbachev's leading rival, held Gorbachev directly responsible for the bloodshed in Lithuania and the country's

"The danger of dictatorship has become a reality," said Yeltsin's message, which was read by a supporter. "The President has started

on the course of whipping up ethnic passions, supporting self proclaimed committees of salvation, striving for power, on the path of justifying the use of weapons against a peaceful population," it said.

Yuri Afanasiev, an historian and leader of the Democratic Russia reform movement, said the protest was called to register "our decisive 'no' to the reactionary course of Gorbachev."

The crowd responded with shouts of "Resign Resign". It was the first time reformers, who until just recently supported Gorbachev, organised a rally with the primary focus being a demand for his resig-

"Hangmen out of the Kremilin" "Down with the Party" Communist "Dictatorship will not pass", the throngs chanted.

"We want those responsible for the butchery (in Vilnius)-Gorbachev, Pugo and Yazov-to resign", one banner said, referring to Interior Minister Boris Pugo and Defence Minsister Dmitri Yazov.

Other banners brandished by the protesters as they marched through central Moscow read: "Today Vilnius, tomorrow Moscow". The rally was organisd by

### 50 per cent fall in international flights By Asiuzzaman Retu

The operation of more than 50 percent international flights through Zia International Airport has been suspended due to shortage of passengers following the outbreak of the Gulf war, a senior airport official said yesterday.

"The number of passengers

fell by 70 to 80 per cent

during the last three days, so

we had to reduce our flights,"

the official said. Normally 7000 to 8000 passengers move through this airport everyday but, after the Gulf war broke out on Thursday the number of passengers has come down to

around 1,000, he said. Till 10 pm yesterday, 852 passengers including 444 foreigners left Bhaka. Most of them were British and

American nationals as the two embassics started evacuation of

### Capital base may be raised to tackle bad debt problem
