Seventy-five Bangladeshis, alongwith about 4,000 other foreign nationals from Iraq have crossed the Jordanian border and are now waiting in Amman for repatriation.

A Foreign Ministry official told reporters that the. Bangladesh mission in Iraq. which had recently been relocated at Amman due to war situation, was making arrangement for the evacuation of Bangladeshis to Cairo through Sucz Canal.

There are a total of 300 Bangladeshis in Iraq while the total number of Bangladeshis in Kuwait will not be less than 3000.

Meanwhile. the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) and International Red Cross Society are making arrangement for evacuation of about three to four thousand stranded expatriates including Bangladeshis in Amman through Cairo, the Bangladesh mission in Jordan is continuously keeping in touch with these organisations.
