

75 Bangladeshis flee Iraq to Amman

Seventy-five Bangladeshis, along with about 4,000 other foreign nationals from Iraq have crossed the Jordanian border and are now waiting in Amman for repatriation.

A Foreign Ministry official told reporters that the Bangladesh mission in Iraq, which had recently been relocated at Amman due to war situation, was making arrangement for the evacuation of Bangladeshis to Cairo through Suez Canal.

There are a total of 300 Bangladeshis in Iraq while the total number of Bangladeshis in Kuwait will not be less than 3000.

Meanwhile, the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) and International Red Cross Society are making arrangement for evacuation of about three to four thousand stranded expatriates including Bangladeshis in Amman through Cairo, the Bangladesh mission in Jordan is continuously keeping in touch with these organisations.

According to available information, 166 workers of Khulna AL, BNP granted bail

From Our Correspondent KHULNA, Jan 19: One hundred and 66 workers of Awami League and BNP, charged with election violence, were granted bail by the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate when they appeared before his court today.

BNP lodged nine cases and AL five cases since the violence started on January 13, the last date of filing of nominations.

At least 25 persons were injured, six of them seriously in scattered violence during the 5 days in and around the city.

There are more than two lakh Bangladeshis in Saudi Arabia now and the total number of Bangladeshis in the Gulf region is more than 450,000.

DUTA holds anti-war rally

Teachers of Dhaka University Monday brought out a peace procession in the city to protest the war in the Gulf, reports UNB.

The procession, under the banner of the Dhaka University Teachers' Association (DUTA), began from the Aparajeya Bangla and paraded different city streets before terminating at the Central Shaheed Minar.

Prof. Anwarullah Chowdhury, President DUTA, Prof. Shahadat General Secretary DUTA and Dr. Abu Ahmed, a

teacher of the Department of Economics, addressed the gathering there.

Speakers at the gathering urged the warring countries to sit for discussions and shun the path of war. They also called for immediate withdrawal of allied forces from the Gulf and Iraqi troops from Kuwait.

They also said that peace cannot be restored in the Middle East without the removal of Israelis from the occupied Arab land and solution of the Palestinian crisis.

Chinese book fair begins

A Chinese book fair began at the Central Public Library in Dhaka on Monday, reports BSS. Adviser for Culture Prof. Iajuddin Ahmed said that Bangladesh had age-old relations with China. The existing cultural and economic relations between the two countries could be strengthened further through exchange of books through fairs, he added.

Prof. Iajuddin urged all concerned to write books highlighting the background and objectives of Language Movement, War of Independence and the present democratic process which, he said, could help the next generation know the real history of the country.

The book fair, jointly organised by Chalanika Baighar and China International Book Trading Corporation (CIBTC), will conclude on February 3.

Presided over by President of Bangladesh-China Institute, Nurul Huda Mirza, the function was also addressed, among others, by Chinese Ambassador in Bangladesh Chen Songlu, chief of Public Library Shah Md Nazrul Alam and General Manager of Chalanika Baighar Mosarufuddin Bhuiyan.

APSU plea to purge corrupt bureaucrats

The All-Party Students' Unity (APSU) Monday staged demonstration in front of the secretariat demanding immediate purge of corrupt bureaucrats and associates of ousted President Ershad from the administration, reports UNB.

It also submitted a memorandum to the Establishment Ministry demanding an inquiry committee to probe corruption, misuse of power and misappropriation of public funds in all sectors during the autocratic regime.

The demonstrators also demanded immediate publication of a white-paper on the corruption committed in dif-

ferent government and semi-government offices during Ershad's rule.

An eight-member delegation led by DUCSU GS Khairul Kabir Khokan handed over the memorandum to the Establishment Secretary.

The demonstration rally was addressed by Faizul Haqim, Akhter Subhan Mashrur, Mosharraf Hossain and Rezaul Karim Hiron.

Monday's demonstration was part of a long-drawn programme APSU has taken up to resist political rehabilitation of Jatiya Party and removal of Ershad's accomplices from the administration.

115 BCS officials to be withdrawn from base posts

A total of 115 officials, appointed under the Bangladesh Civil Service (BCS) Administrative cadre would be withdrawn from the base posts in the Secretariat and sent to field level jobs within the next 15 days, reports BSS.

Establishment Secretary agreed to this demand placed by the BCS Secretariat cadre association when its members met him on Sunday.

Secretariat cadre has long been demanding that base

posts in the secretariat should be solely reserved for its members.

Only 100 base posts are reserved for Administrative cadre men in the secretariat but 215 posts are now being occupied by them.

Immediate merger of the Administrative and Secretariat cadre services as recommended by the Chisty Committee was also pressed during the meeting.

Withdrawal of troops demanded

It also demanded the immediate recovery of all illegal arms, shifting of the deposed President Ershad and his associates to jail and stopping of all activities against the liberty and sovereignty of Bangladesh.

Mr Mohiuddin Ahmed, Director General, Ministry of Foreign Affairs has been appointed Deputy Permanent Representative at the Permanent mission of Bangladesh to the United Nations, New York, reports BSS.

Born in January 1944 Mr Ahmed did his MA in Economics from Karachi University in 1965.

A career diplomat, Mr Ahmed joined the erstwhile Pakistan Foreign Service in 1967 and held various important positions at country's missions abroad including London, Geneva, Jeddah, New Delhi and Jakarta and at the headquarter in Dhaka.

He also served the ministries of Agriculture and Industries as Joint Secretary on deputation.

Zaker party's plea to uphold Islamic values

Leader of Zaker Party Pirzada Mostafa Amir Faisal Monday called for electing his party's candidates in next month's polls to uphold Islamic values, according to a press release of the party, reports UNB.

AL instruction to disappointed partymen

Awami League has instructed all its leaders and workers, who did not get party nomination but submitted nomination papers to the returning officers to refrain from campaigning for their own selves and work in favour of the official nominees.

Awami League General Secretary Sajeda Chowdhury in a statement yesterday said party president Sheikh Hasina had instructed all party leaders, who did not get nomination, to withdraw their nomination papers. She said disciplinary action would be taken against the persons who would defy the instruction.

In another statement, Sajeda Chowdhury advised all party candidates to submit statements of their sources of fund for election campaign and their assets and liabilities.

She has also requested them to collect the prescribed Form-17 A and 17-B from the returning officers.

Rangpur DC not withdrawn

The government on Monday made it clear that the Deputy Commissioner of Rangpur, Mr. Giasuddin Ahmed, has not been withdrawn from that district and he retains his position, reports BSS.

The government issued the clarification in view of a report appearing in a section of press on Monday about the transfer of Mr. Ahmed.
