"There are facto ries I know where women do handi crafts to be sold to handicraft shops, and to be exported abroad I am in touch with such employers but I prefer to stay at home with my family, and work at my own pace at my job. I must supervise my six grandchildren and keep an eye over my daughters-in-law Earlier, fifteen to twenty years ago, had four young chil dren of my own to fend for, and did not have so much of lei sure to pursue a task that I enjoy," she

Elaborating on her 'katha' stitchin, she narrates, "I de about five 'kathas' in a month. I get Tk. 40 to Tk. 50 for each piece. I can get as much as Tk. 200 for the ones with pattern or 'nakshi'. The pay ment is made ac cording to the extent of the detailed work and the length of the 'katha'. Sometimes go in for 'nakshis' for pillow cases, table cloth and for fronts of woman in the neighbourhood for Tk. 200. "This was just not




