### Case against two BJMC ex-officials

According to the proceedings of the case, it appears that by violating the ban on sale of jute at discount and without government approval for giving discount on BCR grade of jute former Director of Jute Corporation T.I.M. Hasan Imam, and General Manager T.I.M. Nurunnabi sold 2,777 bales of jute at 40 per cent discount to Messrs Abdur Razzak LTD causing a loss of Taka 11.52,482 to the government. the handout said.

Similarly, without government approval 8,332 bales of BWCB and 8,888 bales of BWR jute were sold to Sonalt Ash LTD and Sonar Bangla PAT Baling causing loss to the gov ernment Taka 70,65,732.
