Wicketkeeper Hashan Tillekeratne took four catches, indicating how well the Sri Lankan bowlers used the conditions. They were supported by good all round fielding.

Sri Lanka began batting without opener Roshan Mahanama, who was forced from the field early in the day after injuring his right hand while fielding at slip. He is expected to bat on Friday.

Although Charith Senanayake was caught behind off Willy Watson without scoring, the Sri Lankans batted fairly comfortably through to

Tillekeratne, promoted to open the batting, scored a bright 21 off 37 balls before falling to Danny Morrison just before end of play.

Neither Watson nor Morrison seemed to get as much assistance from the drying wicket as the Sri, Lankans.


