Tubewells supply gas instead of water

BHOLA, Feb 3: Gas available in large volume from the tube wells sunk for water is being used in many hotels, restaurants and for domestic purposes in Burhanuddin upazila of Bhola. This has met the demand for fuel to a great ex-

In Hakimpur Bazar of the upazila along with its adjoining villages are getting regular supply of gas instead of 31 deep tubewells installed for irrigation. The inhabitants have devised techniques to transmit gas unhindered to household ovens and commercial establishments. Moreover gas lights in larger numbers are found glowing in the dwellings adjacent to Hakimpur Bazar.

The cylinders have the capacity of holding little water that comes out along with the gas and then despatched to different connected lines. Professor Sunil Baran of B.M. College identified the gas as carbohydrate which is commonly used in fertilizer facto-


