Romanian booters resent double standards

BUCHAREST, Feb 4 Romanian soccer players have accused their national federation of double standards in refusing to recognise them as professionals and then cashing in on their skills when they are sold to foreign clubs, reports Reuter.

About 100 players from Bucharest First Division clubs Steaua, Dinamo and Rapid as

well as Politchnica from Timisoara, founded a players trade union earlier this year to stand up for the rights of players and improve working con-

We are paid as employees of certain ministries for services in the field but when we are sold to foreign clubs we are treated as professional soccer players," said Dinamo Bucharest goalkeeper Bogdan Stelea, the union leader, at the weekend.

The national federation has outlawed the new league of soccer players on grounds that the players are barred under the terms of their employment from membership of

"Romanian soccer players are not paid as soccer players. Steaua's players are employees of the Defence Ministry, Dinamo's of the Interior Ministry and Rapid's of the Transport Ministry," said Federation disciplinary chief Florin Gatejanu.

Defence and Interior ministry employees may not join unions while Transport ministry workers may only join an existing union in that sector. Stelea said this was clearly un-

PARIS Feb 4: The French have a word for it, they always say, but the problem is that when it comes to sport they don't so they have had to make them up.

With English creeping into the language of sport more and more, the French decided to set up a special committee to find French alternatives to a host of tried and tructed English terms, reports AFP.

Under the latest list published by the Commissariat for the Erench Language, footballers will find their managers will now be "manageurs" and their coaches "entraineurs" and they will have to get used to taking a "tir d'angle" instead of a corner.


