### Fire destroys Colombian forest

BOGOTA, Feb 8: Fire is sweeping through a worldrenowned Colombian nature reserve, destroying thousands of hectares of forest which are a haven for many rare animals and plants. The fire, which began last weekend, has now destroyed 72,000 hectares (about 178,000 acres), or about onetenth of the vast Sierra de la Macarena reserve, and is still burning, officials said, reports Reuter.
