

Indian miscreants on rampage : one killed

An Indian national was killed and several others, including three Bangladeshis, were injured in a clash at a frontier village of Chapainawabganj on Saturday, a BDR press release said in Dhaka on Sunday, reports UNB.

The press release stated that a group of miscreants numbering 120 to 125 from across the border suddenly attacked some shepherd boys in Shitalmara of the north-western district and tried to snatch away their cattlehead by force.

The miscreants who were armed with lethal weapons, started beating off the young boys mercilessly.

The members of BDR from the nearly frontier post rushed to the spot upon hearing the hue and cry of the shepherd boys.

The BDR personnel were also attacked by the intruding miscreants who opened fire and injured three Bangladeshi persons.

To disperse the miscreants and save themselves the riflemen opened fire resulting in death of the intruder on the spot and injuring several others.

The miscreants later managed to escape. The body was handed over to Indian border security forces.

A flag meeting between the commander of 31 rifles battalion and the concerned Indian authorities was held in this connection the press release added.

New dimension in fight on BNP-AL-Jamaat

KHULNA, Feb 10: With only 16 days left for the parliamentary polls election campaign by different political parties getting momentum in all the six constituencies of the district despite snatching of almost everybody's attention by the Gulf war news.

Multi-coloured posters and banners have given new dimension to the green villages beside the colourful towns. A wall will hardly be found without drawings of polls symbols like boat, sheaf of paddy, balance, plough or a lock with fervent appeal to cast votes in favour of the respective candidates.

A section of the public are, however, scared of possible untoward incidents on the election dates while many of them are hopeful of true democratic atmosphere.

Muniruddin Biswas, a small shop-keeper at Tala Bazar expressed his satisfaction over the government's neutrality in holding the election which according to him was conspicuously absent during the past regimes.

The scenario were almost identical on village-roads of Terokhada, Dumuria, Battalganj and Paikgachha. Young boys were publicising by microphones in favour of their candidates. The publicist gets Taka 50 only while the rickshaw puller takes Taka 100 per

Two Jamaat candidates —

Maulana A.K.M. Yusuf and Alhaj Md. Shamsur Rahman who are being considered as two strong contenders for Khulna Two and Khulna Three constituencies have been shaken substantially in the face of BNP candidates. However, Jamaat Chief Abbas Ali Khan's recent visit to Khulna has been able to mend little of the damage.

But local political observers are of the opinion that the damage already done to this party by Begum Zia's harsh comments against them in at least five election rallies in and around Khulna city in the last week may not be repaired fully by soft-spoken Abbas Ali Khan.

Local Awami League has also been hit tremendously by Khaleda Zia's visit to this area, political circle opined. Awami League processions are trying to carry public attention by carrying big portraits of their late leader Sk. Mujib and their party chief Sk. Hasina, along with their traditional election symbol of boat.

Awami League has drawn another curious strategy of chanting 'Allah-ho-Akbar' and 'La-illah-illah-Lahu' slogans simultaneously with 'Joi-Bangla' and 'Joi-Bangabandhu' to attract the Muslim voters of whom a large portion is West Bengal settlers and traditionally anti-Awami League.

BSP demands neutral Wage Board

The Bangladesh Sangbadpara Parishad (BSP) has demanded the setting up of a neutral Wage Board for the employees of the newspaper industries, reports BSS.

In a statement, the Parishad said the Wage Board set up by the previous Ershad Government was boycotted by the BSP since dearness allowances and other measures were taken unilaterally causing much stress on the industry.

The statement said the Wage Board made recommendations increasing the salaries and allowances ranging from 90 to 100 per cent and other burdens had also been imposed on the management. The Parishad said all these including the hike in the prices of newsprint made the news-paper industry miserable.

The executive committee of the BSP met Sunday with Mr. Moinul Hossein in the chair and agreed to give BSP's position on the Wage Board, the statement said.

Stating that many newspapers do not have the capacity to pay salaries, the statement said the policy of the Ershad Government was to keep the entire industry in financial crisis and only maintaining some pro-Government news-papers functioning.

'Pressure groups threatening press'

Speakers at a discussion said the press could not play its due role as the autocratic mentality was not gone with the fall of Ershad. He said there are pressure groups who are threatening free functioning of the press. Criticising Special Powers Act the BPPU President said it is in existence like a tranquilizer which could become as harmful as before. President of the Editors Council Sanaullah Noori, former Chairman of the Dhaka University Journalism Department Tawhidul Anwar, eminent lawyer Gazi Shamsur Rahman, Chairman of the Daulat Bangla and Times Trust Council Obaidul Huq, and President of National Lawyers Council Khondaker Mahbubuddin Ahmed spoke at the discussion which was presided over by Justice Rahim Islam, President of the Press Council.

Speaking as the chief guest Vice Chancellor of Dhaka University Professor Maniruzzaman Miah said for establishing real democracy, people have to be helped in choosing the right persons in the polls. He said it was the newspaper which can play a vital role in helping the people by projecting and analysing the programmes of different parties.

He said a particular newspaper could commit mistake but as a class the newspaper community could not commit mistake.

The Dhaka University Vice Chancellor opined that rigid control of the newspapers was unnecessary as self-censorship would emerge out of responsibility.

Barrister Mainul Hossain, President of the Sangbadpara Parishad said democratic system of governance was inevitable for the existence and growth of independent newspapers. He said after the fall of autocratic regime it was the responsibility of the press to form a healthy consensus.
