2 die in separate incidents

12 jute mills incur loss

February 13: twelve jute mills of Khulna-Jessore indus trial belt are facing acute financial crisis failing to market their jute products, reports

According to sources, these mills under BJMC have been incurring huge financial loss since the month of June last year due to stoppage of export low quality production and stockpiling of products.

jute sacks (25,000 metric tons) worth about Taka 35 crore and Hessian goods (15,000 metric tons) valued at Taka 36 crore of exportable quality are lying unsold in the godowns.

There has been no shipment from June 1990 as purchasers have stopped buying jute goods. A large number of countries in the Middle East, Africa UK and USA are reported to have stopped their regular business with BJMC due unavoidable reasons.
