Amidst understand able pomp and fanfare, the annual show of the Bangladesh National Rose Society was opened Friday morning by Professor Muniruzamman Mian, the Vice Chancellor of the Dhaka University, at the Women's Sports Complex. Of the 400 varieties of roses that reportedly exist in Bangladesh, 50 of them were present for the colourful and unique display. One found roses of all types, sizes and colours at the sun-drenched exhibition. This included hybrids, ancient varieties. imported items, miniature and full-blown sizes. Bushes, creepers, and "standard" plants were all brought in .

The varieties ranged from Double Deligh Crimson Glory, Princess. Pot O'Gold, Lovers' Meet ing, and King's Ransom to Prima Ballerina.

and maroon. The varieties had been cultivated with beautiful blends of colours. The forms of roses varied from the ones with the delicate charm of the wild rose to the double-centred sculptured blooms of the modern hybrids. The sizes ranged from tiny miniatures - not more then one and a half inch in diameter- to the prime exhibition targets many inches across.

Tipu Sultan Khan, the Joint Secretary of the Rose Society says, "We have so little space and such a problem of population. Why do we not relieve it some what by growing roses and other plants on our terraces? Everybody needs beauty

around htm. You may not have 250 potted plants like me but you can have a dozen, and in them grow even fruit and vegetable. That way you cut the cost of a lot of your daily shopping."

Tipu Sultan has grown plants ranging from papayas, "kazi payara," lemon, chillie, to oranges and grapes on his terrace garden. Discussing his success with his roses, he says: "Put in half a pot of soil with half of 'gobor' manure. Mix this with crushed bone-meal and mustard 'khoil'. Soak this in blood-dust and water for 15 days you plant your seedling. The plant must be sprayed every week with anti-insect powder. Anti-fungus powder must

also be put every month. It is no child's play growing roses. According to rose-lovers, you have to devote about three hours a day to the plants. Polash, a businessman, has spent about a lakh of takas on his collection of roses since he got wrapped up in this hobby over ten years ago. Keep ing a rose garden is like keeping an elephant for a pet, he remarks.

Mahmuda Ahmed, another ardent rose cultivator, has growing of roses in her family for generations. "One spends money on items like cigarettes Doesn't one? Why not invest the money on a use ful hobby?" These beau tiful blossoms provide a diversion in a society which is so short in rec reational facilities, says F. Hadi, an ex-President of the Rose Society.

The rose has been an integral part of our Muslim culture. When the Arabs moved from Persia which they conquered in the 7th century, this flower of the Middle East -Star photo followed them to Spain. It

was during the Crusades that the rose was introduced to the rest of Europe.

Roses have been used as medicines since World War II in the western world. Rose hips are an established source of Vitamin C. They are used in essential oils and for scents in cosmetics and perfumes. Large quantities are grown in France, India and Iran for the perfume specially attar of

Few people fail to enjoy the delightful fragrance of most roses which range from the odour of the damask to scents of other kinds that brings spices . fruit and even green tea in mind.


