## In Praise of the Teacup

Once upon a time there used to be only one canteen at the Dhaka University. Famous in history as the "Modhu's Canteen", it became a symbol of students' revolt, burgeoning nationalism and long overdue bills unpaid. Madhu, slain by the Pakistani Army on the night of 25th March, 1971, was in so many ways a representative of an era. The value of that era included sexism. The canteen was an exclusive male preserve. One or two brave souls of the feminine variety may have drank from the not so clean cups, but Madhu's Canteen belonged to the boys.

If Madhu's domain was politics then Shareef's domain was literature. Housed in a decrepit semi-pucca construction it moved in and around the Public Library, kept going more by

patronage than legal rights. And many of today's famous writers first had their inspirations soaked by the tea and biryani of Shareef Miah But despite all that romantic rhymes and blank verses, no ladies were welcomed. "The Muse was kept but since then, that is the early seventies, things

poetic was in full cry the TSC canteen was one place where the boys and the girls sat together and aside from drinking tea and a trifle fancier snacks from the other canteens helped break such socio-sexual barriers down. It was one place where poets and politicians didn't show up much, drawing the more "mainstream" crowd who didn't discriminate as much as the others did. But it was a signal of things to come.

The situation is very different now. Not only are there a number of canteens including the large one run by DUCSU but the ramshackle tea shops emblematic of the earlier time have all but disappeared. The boys and girls not just mix

together but sit and share refreshments in a free manner. They are not just more cosmopolitan but with interest in fields beyond rhyme and polemics. Their own life style has liberated them. Competing with boys for top exam positions and top jobs in the real world, the girls have vanquished the reason d'ettre for segregation.

At the level of the teacup it may seem like a teacup but eating together has become just as important as eating itself Many of the canteens have developed a distinct culture of their own. For example, the one on the TSC Sarak Dwip (road island) is frequented by those who are cultural activists and are often holding a show either inside TSC or on the no less grand main street. The punctured asphalt road is the signature

of the arrival of the culture o equality, and boys and girls who drink Cokes nunch on what

Nor are there any "untoward" incidents which could cause anxiety to parents worried about the "moral state" of freshmen and sophomores. That has been achieved because over a period of time the canopy of freedom and responsibility has been raised at the august institution. And in raising that canopy with a flag flying high the humble teacup which brought the girl and the boy together as equals and sparked off the ideas and feelings of the future played an important role. 


