Mushroom growth of substandard hotels



According to sources foodstuffs are being prepared and sold in most unhygienic manner causing different gastro-intestinal and communicable diseases. Numerous shopkeepers and hawkers dressed in dirty and unclean clothes are seen selling these foodstuffs to their customers on different footpaths over the nose of the law enforcing agencies.

It is alleged the sanitary inspectors of pourashavas and upazilas are not examining foodstuffs to detect adulteration. Consequently the traders are continuing their illegal business freely.

Besides, bandrolless bidies are being sold openly in the town and village areas of the district. Dishonest traders are earning a lot of black money depriving the government a huge revenue worth lakhs taka per month.

Chicken pox breaks out in Madaripur From Our Correspondent

MADARIPUR, Feb 22: Chicken pox has broken out in an epidemic form in different

parts of the district. The worst affected upazilas are Sadar, Rajoir and Kalkini, hospital sources said. Doctors said at least seven patients attacked with this disease are coming to hospital and health complexes datly for treatment.

Besides a large number of patients in rural areas are being treated by homoeo and unant doctors, it is learnt. Doctors attributed paucity of drinking water to be the reason for outbreak of the disease.

1900 acres khas land distributed PATUAKHALI, Feb 22: about

1900 acres of khas land have so far been distributed among the landless and distressed people in six upazilas of the district.

According to official sources, 275 acres were distributed in Sadar, 125 acres in Mirzaganj, 300 acres in Bauphal, 375 in Dasmina, 625 acres in Galachipa and 200 acres in Kalapara upazilas.

Meanwhile, works on 72 uplift schemes are underway in six upaztlas of the district under dry season Food for Works Programme. According to official
