





# Revamping refs

ZURICH , Feb 23: The

upper age limit for referees taking charge of international matches will be reduced from 50 to 45 by 1994, the refereeing commission of world football's governing body. FIFA, decided here on Friday, reports AFP.

And as part of a plan to modernise and adapt refereeing standards to the present day game, national football associations will be asked to run training courses for linesmen, in order to create a FIFA roster of linesmen. Each national FA will be able to nominate seven referees and seven linesmen.

In addition to specialised linesmen, FIFA plan to add a fourth official to the team for each match—a substitute referee, operating on the touchline, and ready to replace the referee in case of injury, as has been the case for the World Cup final.

But their is no question that the substitute would have access to video recordings to enable him to intervene and overturn the referee's decision. FIFA spokesman Guido Tognoni said. "International matches will,

in future, be conducted by a referee—as at the World Cup final competition- with the substitute referee providing supervisory back-up on the side-lines," he said.
