The workshop is expected to begin its trial production from January, 1992. The project taken with Taka 106 crore foreign exchange component also included construction of 201 units of residential accomodation, which has already been completed.

Till now the government has spent a total of Taka 66.60 crore for implementation of the project, according to a Bangladesh Railway press re-

At present, construction works of main workshop building, main stores building, administration building and some others are going on in full swing. So far purchase orders for 675 items of machinery and equipment have been placed

# Involvement of 50 pc women in youth programmes planned

A comprehensive programme has been undertaken to increase participation of women upto 50 per cent in the youth development shames, official sources said in Dhaka on Friday.

The programme is a part of a comprehensive plan for youth development under the Fourth Five-Year Plan.

According to the 1991 Census Report, youth constitutes more than 30 per cent of total population of Bangladesh with an increasing trend in shares of this group in total population. About 85 per cent of the

youth live in rural areas, overwhelming majority of them neither attend any academic institutions nor have much opportunity to learn skills suitable for productive activities. Most of them are handicapped with severe poverty, limited education, training and employment and thus remain outside the main stream of devel opment. Consequently they often develop regressive social attitude and values and suffer from deep frustration causing threat to harmonious social order. On the other hand, the vast petential, vigour and vital ity of the youth can be turned into a great productive force if organized and mobilised prop-

contributions to the development process, the government has placed due importance to youth development programmes in order to facilitate their participation in organized activities leading to their physical, mental, social and economic development.

The Ministry of Youth Development was created in December 1978 and subsequently the Department of Youth Development was established in 1981 to provide unified direction and coordination to youth development pro-

#### The beginning

Independent youth devel opment programmes under the Ministry of Youth Development started first with the Two Year Plan (1978-80). During the Two Year Plan an amount of Tk 9.50 crore was provided for Youth Development Programmes, out of which Tk 7.01 crore was utilized and 36,200 unem ployed were trained in differ ent fields.

In the Second Five Year Plan (1980-85) an amount of Tk 26 crore was allocated for Youth Development Progra mmes. Out of which Tk 19.60 crore was utilised. Approximately 42,000 unemployed youth received training in different fields during this period and 2.999 trained youths started self-employment projects. In the Third Five Year Plan

(1985-90), an amount of Tk17 crore was allocated for youth development activities. A new project entitled "Upazila Resource Development and Employment Project" (URDEP) aiming poverty alleviation among the youth wrough sel employment was included since July 1988 outside the TFYP project portfolio. So far, 7 upazilas have come under this project in two phases. An additional amount of Tk 7 crore was allocated for implementation of this project. During the TFYP period, following projects were taken up for implementation:

Skill Development Training for Unemployed Youth: ii. Support for Self-em ployment Activities for the

Trained Youth: iii. Youth Motivation, Publi cation and Award, and

iv. Upazila Resource Development and Employment Project (URDEP) Phase-I & II.

#### Fourth Plan objectives

The major objective of the sub-sector development Programme during the Fourth Five Year Plan would be to organize and mobilize the Youth properly in order to enable them to participate effective in national development. Some of the specific objectives of youth development programmes during the period would be as fol-

i. to increase the participation of women upto 50 per cent in the youth development programmes; ii. to alleviate poverty

among the youth through increased self-employment pro- witnesses said.

iii. to equip the youths with working skill and suitable training in technical, vocational and professional fields,

iv. to organize youth groups and motivate them to assist community development through Voluntary Youth Organtzations (VYOs).

#### Major strategies Since education and train-

ing is one of the basic needs for developing human capabili ties, emphasis would be placed on proper education and training in various professions within the broad framework of human resource development during the plan period. In order to realize the objectives. effectives measures would be taken to ensure cooperation and coordination among various ministries and strengthen NGOs involvement on a selective basis. More organized training of youth for employment would be under taken along with training programmes organized in cooperation with the private sector in order to meet the effective needs of the private sector. Training would also be imparted through educational institutions for transforming students as social workers and catalytic agents for desired changes. Within the above broad framework, the follow ing strategies would be emphasized:

i. programmes of group training for the unemployed youths in different trades and follow-up credit facilities for income generating activities. ii. 50 per cent women

trainees in all training programmes to ensure adequate participation of women.

iti. emphasis on modern and non-traditional areas of training with emphasis on optimal use of existing training facilities and creation of selected new facilities for enhancing training infrastruc-

iv. training and credit programmes to motivate youths to take-up self-employment both in rural and urban areas and v. motivation of youths in

community development.
