

Thousands of Serbs were fleeing Croatia after hearing rumours circulated by Serb nationalists that they face slaughter by Croats, news reports said Tuesday, states AP.

The Scrbian-based state Tanjug news agency said 20.000 Serbs, mostly women and children, fled to Scrbia by late Monday. It said a 'welcome committee' was formed for them in the border

town of Apatin. Croatian authorities estimated the number of refugees at 3,000. Serbs and Croats, rivals for centuries, are locked in a struggle that has pushed

this troubled Balkan federation to the brink of civil war.

Serbia's Communist rulers want the country of six republics and two provinces remain a centralised federation. Croatia's non-communist leaders demand Yugoslavia be transformed into a loose alliance of sovereign states.

The communist-controlledmedia in Serbia has charged for months that Croatia's center-right leadership, elected last spring, is "fascist" and seeks the genocide or extermination of all Serbs in Croatia. Serbs make up 12 per cent of Croatia's five million people.

Parliament summoned on Apr 5

Acting President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed has summoned the first session of the fifth Jattya Sangsad (Parliament) on April 5 at 9 a.m. The new parliament was elected on February 27.

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) emerged as the single largest party bagging 138 seats. The Awamt League got 83 seats followed by the Jattya Party 35 and the Jamaat-e-Islami 18. Seven small political parties and independents got 18 seats out of 294. Repolling will be held in four constituencies on March 9. Fresh elecgant and Kushtia on March 14 and 28 where elections were postponed following the death of candidates.

The Election Commission will hold elections to 30 women seats. The elections to reserved seats for the women will be completed by April 2. according to Election Commisston sources. Bangladesh Nationalist Party has invited applications from the intending candidates by March 10.

High Court benches of the Bangladesh Supreme Court at Rangpur, Jessore, Barisal Chittagong, Comilla and Sylhet now stand dissolved. The cases now pending in those courts for disposal will be sent to Dhaka, the permanent seat of the Supreme Court.

The Chief Justice of Bangladesh by a notification on February 26 cancelled the formation of courts in those places. The Chief Justice in another notification on the same day omitted the Chapter IIIA Supreme Court (High Court Division) Rules of 1973. Volume 1 which provided for holding of the sessions of the High Court benches outside
