BNP starts preparatory work on national budget

Formidable challenges await incoming govt

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) will go for "a closer scrutiny" of all government expenditures, both recurring and development, under the next national budget.

This was stated by former finance minister Saifur Rahman who is also a central leader of BNP, in an interview with The Daily Star. After victory in the parliamentary elections, the BNP chairperson, Begum Khaleda Zia assigned Saifur Rahman to do the preparatory work on behalf of the party for the national budget 1991-92.

He reviewed the fiscal outlook for 1990-91 with a bleak tone. "There will be a substantial shortfall in domestic resources even with the reduction of Annual Development Programme (ADP). The deficit financing will be on the rise", he observed. He said that he had already assessed the situation on the basis of facts and figures, made available by the interim government.

He stated that mobilisation of domestic resources for development financing would be the most formidable challenge for any incoming government. "The best way to mobilise more local resources is to cut down unproductive expenditures in all sectors. Belt-tightening will be needed in all spheres so that resources can be released to productive sectors", he said.

About BNP's priorities for the forthcoming national budget and also on the broad economic front, he said the party would stress all-out support to boost agricultural output and expand operations of export-oriented sectors.

Saifur Rahman said the most pressing need of the hour would be to ensure maximum utilisation of existing capacity in productive sectors before making any new investments.

About the budgetary management tasks, he observed that the fallen Ershad regime made "inflexible expenditure commitments making it extremely difficult for any incoming government to go for any

severe pruning exercises in different areas".

He added: "A cursory review of the economy showed that the Ershad government had totally destroyed financial discipline through overcentralisation of the decision-making process at the highest level. The ADP was concentrated on mandated projects without having relevance to the growth of real productive potentials of the economy".

The former finance minister of the Zia regime observed that total investments in the economy during the last years were negative other than those in garments and a few other areas. "This is the worst legacy

Khaleda seeks help to build a corruption-free country

CHITTAGONG, Mar 10: Begum Khaleda Zia, chairperson of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) today called upon the people to cooperate with her party in rebuilding the country, shattered by a nine-year autocratic rule.

Addressing a series of huge public meetings in Chittagong, Begum Zia sought the support of all nationalist and patriotic forces.

Begum Zia thanked the people for electing her and said that her party was about to ascend to power with a pledge to build the country in line with the ideals of Shaheed President Zia.

2.1 lakh men begin head count Tuesday

The third population census in independent Bangladesh will be conducted between March 12 and 15.

A total of 2.1 lakh enumerators will do the counting simultaneously all over the country. Abdus Salam, Secretary, Statistics Division told a news conference on Sunday.

The population census will be formally launched by counting Acting President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed on March 12 morning.

Salam said that between March 11 midnight and March 12 morning, floating populations in city streets, railway stations, bus and launch terminals, mosques, hotels, restaurants and jails will be counted.

The census will cost about Taka 28 crore. Preliminary report of the census will be an-

CHITTAGONG, Mar 10: At least 20 students including several admission seekers were injured when rival student organisations clashed in Chittagong University campus at 11.30 am Sunday.

Kausar Ahmed (22) was admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) in critical condition after receiving stab injuries. Two other students with stab injuries were also admitted to CMCH.

Thousands on streets urge Gorbachev to quit

73 years ago.

The demonstration in Moscow and other cities came exactly one week before a nationwide referendum on a Gorbachev-backed treaty, which aims to hold the Soviet Union's 15 restive republics together by decentralizing power. Opponents say the Union Treaty does not go far enough.

The crowd, estimated at 500,000 by journalists and one of the speakers, was the biggest anti-government demonstration in Moscow since the Communists took power

has been done for an anti-government demonstration.

Several anti-government demonstrations have taken place there in the past year, the largest in February 1990 with an estimated 250,000 protesters.

An estimated 70,000 people gathered in freezing rain in Leningrad, and the official news agency Tass reported protests in Sverdlovsk, Irkutsk, Kazan, Syktyvkar, Ulan-Due, Petropavlovsk-Kamch-

atsky and Omsk. Tass gave no crowd estimates.

In Moscow, the demonstrators yelled their approval when pro-democracy activists called for support of Russian President Boris Yeltsin in his political battle with Soviet President Gorbachev.

Yeltsin, too, has called for Gorbachev's resignation and replacement by the Federation Council, which includes the presidents of the 15 Soviet republics.

Prominent radicals told the demonstrators next Sunday's vote was an attempt by the Communist Party to preserve its power and privileges and keep the restive republics in its thrall.

Their current programme is one of restoration — restoration of the links of the command economy and an attempt to keep the Soviet Union under diktat from the centre," said Moscow Mayor Gavril Popov.
