Brothers benefit from Abahani's lapses

Two dropped catches by Abahani Kriya Chakra fielders allowed Brothers Union to recover from a disastrous start to finish on 229 all out on the first day of their two-day 75-overs-a-side Navana Premier Division cricket league match at the Dhaka Stadium.

Reigning champions Abahani, in reply, were 49 for two wickets in 14 overs when stumps were drawn for the day.

Brothers' skipper Atahar Ali Khan, winning the toss, decided to bat. His decision appeared to have been an unwise one when his side was reeling at 26 for the loss of four wickets. National players Farooq and Atahar Ali himself both went for ducks. Akram Khan and opener Zahed Razaq Masoom managed to score just six runs each. Abahani's medium-pace bowler Babu took three of those wickets while Sri Lankan Nishantha Ranatunga claimed the other one.

Salahuddin joined the other Brothers opener Shovon and the two put their heads down to repair the early damage. When the score reached 61, Salahuddin was run out for a patient five runs going for a cheeky single.

Brothers' West Bengal recruit Arup Bhattacharya then

joined Shovon. The left-handed Arup betrayed a sudden rush of blood and tried to lift. Abahani leg-spinner Nadir Shah, only to sky the ball at mid-wicket where Efec, to everyone's dismay, dropped the simplest of catches. This was before Arup could open his account. The lucky Arup and Shovon then made the most of the good fortune to add thirty invaluable runs for the sixth wicket.

Shovon, who was playing with great discipline, then lofted an easy catch to Nishantha, having failed to read Ehsan's slower delivery.

Shovon made 42 well-grafted runs. Brothers lost their seventh wicket when Arup, on 24, tried to lift Efec out of the ground only to see Javed Omar Golla make a fine running catch.

Sri Lankan fast bowler T.L. Fernando joined all-rounder Gollam Farooq Suru.

Abahani captain Rafiqul Alam made a costly mistake when he dropped Suru early in his innings off Efec's bowling. Fernando and Suru added 87 priceless runs for the eighth wicket. Which could prove extremely dear for the champions.

Fernando ran himself out rather needlessly while going for a non-existent second run. His brilliant 50 off just 69 balls, studded with four bound-

aries and one straight six off Efec, brought Brothers back in the game.

Suru followed soon afterwards after making 33. Prince, 17 not out, and Shamshul 10 added 27 vital runs for the last wicket.

Babu with three wickets for 37 runs and Nishantha with two for 40 were the leading Abahani bowlers. Asif, Efec and Ehsan bagged one wicket each.

Abahani, in reply, were 49 for two wickets in 14 overs by the close.

Abahani have bolstered their batting line-up with the arrival of ex-Sri Lankan Test captain Duleep Mendis, who despite his age is still capable of playing well on the placid Dhaka Stadium wicket.

Abahani resume their innings with Nadir Shah batting on 23 with five boundaries and Asif yet to score. The champions need another 181 runs in their remaining 61 overs with eight wickets in hand. It should be an interesting battle between the Abahani batsmen and the Brothers bowlers today. Brothers possess perhaps the best balanced attack in this year's league while the Abahani batting, without Mendis, has looked rather brittle at times.

The men out in the Abahani innings are Sohail for 11 and Javed Omar Golla for two, both falling low to Arup Bhattacharya and Prince respectively.

Spanish goalie's world record

PAMPLONA (Spain), Mar 10: Atletico Madrid goalkeeper Abel Resino claimed a world record of 1,230 minutes without conceding a goal in top-level soccer after his side scored a 3-0 away win over Osasuna in the Spanish First Division on Saturday, reports Reuter.

Abel, 31, surpassed the 1,143-minute sequence set by Dino Zoff in the Italian national team between 1972 and 1974. His unbeaten stretch also beat the previous Spanish domestic all-division record of 1,223 minutes established two seasons ago by Manolo Lopez, who was then playing for Second Division Ceuta.

Atletico, second behind Barcelona in the First Division, scored three times in 10 minutes deep into the second half to plunge Osasuna to their first home defeat of the season.

German midfielder Bernd Schuster and Portuguese striker Paulo Futre set up the first goal for Roberto Solozabal in the 70th minute.

Aussies go 2 up



PORT-OF-SPAIN (Trinidad), Mar 10: Australia took a 2-0 lead over the West Indies in a five-match one-day cricket series when they won the second game by 45 runs on Saturday, reports Reuter.

Dean Jones was the mainstay of Australia's 172 for nine in their 34 overs at Queen's Park Oval, scoring 64 before he became one of six victims of Trinidadian bowler Tony Gray.

Des Haynes (45) and Viv Richards (27) both threatened to win the match for the West Indies before Mike Whitney, who finished with three for 41, dismissed both.

As the rate climbed from five-an-over at the beginning, to 84 off 12 and 60 off seven, the match slipped beyond the reach of the West Indies.

Craig McDermott took three for 29 and Mark Waugh two for six as the tail folded and West Indies were dismissed for 127.

Australia began slowly in a match reduced first to 42 overs due to morning rain, then to 34 by a combination of slow over-rates and an unreasonable over-target.

After David Boon departed for five Geoff Marsh found it difficult to make headway against tight bowling, particularly from Curtly Ambrose, and reached a personal run-an-over rate only in the 17th over.

But at the other end Jones was displaying his customary one-day form, driving Malcolm Marshall, cutting Ezra Moseley and swatting Gray. He reached 50 in 59 balls before he was bowled by Gray.

The tall pace bowler had already dismissed Marsh and Allan Border—first ball—in successive deliveries and went on to take six for 50 as the tail collapsed.

The Waugh brothers, Steve with 26 in 30 balls, and Mark 16 in 17, added useful runs. But nobody could get Ambrose

(17 runs off eight over) away. Simmons opened as if determined to pass the target in 10 overs but, having slashed Bruce Reid over extra cover for six, the left-arm had him caught behind for 13.

Haynes took over the chase but lost partners before he was joined by Richards. Their

partnership was the key, and after their departure the West Indies were always losing the chase.
