Iraqi unrest may slow US troops pullout

WASHINGTON, Mar 14: A senior member of a key US Senate committee predicted today that fraqi unrest would slow withdrawal of US forces from the Gulf but said having troops there now was useful, reports Reuter.

"It will delay the withdrawal but I think it will be a matter of days or weeks and not a question of months," Senator William Cohen, a Republican on the Senate Armed Services Committee, said in an interview on US television.

"It would be irresponsible for US to simply pull out and then let the (Iraqi) forces consume themselves without any direction or assistance or en-
