N'ganj AL faces internal feud

NARAYANGANJ, Mar 14: The internal feud between the local AL activists has reached its peak resulting in mudslinging through processions, meetings and distributing leaflets. A faction of the party has already declared six top ranking leaders unwanted criticising their role contrary to party's interest as reflected in

the Parliamentary polls on February 27.

An untoward incident took place between the young and elderly activists of the party while attending a workers' convention of the Narayanganj Zila Awami League at the local Municipal Library Auditorium recently. A group of young AL activists demanded the resignation of some veteran leaders being dissatisfied with their role in the parliamentary polls. They termed the leaders "inactive".

Narayanganj AL and its front organisations jointly staged demonstrations demanding six local leaders' expulsion from the party.

The leaders declared unwanted by a faction are: Anwar Ali, Zila AL President, Mustafaizur Rahman, City AL President, Mobarak Hossain, Zila GS, Mizanur Rahman, Zila AL VP, Dr. S. Hossain and Sultan Mahmood Malik.

Dhaka to remain a great friend: Saudi envoy

Bangladesh would be remembered as a great friend of Saudi Arabia as well as of the Muslim Ummah for its role in the successful ending of the Gulf war, reports BSS.

This was stated by the Saudi Ambassador in Dhaka, Mr. Abdul-Latif Al Maimanee, when he called on the Acting President, Mr. Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed, at the President's Secretariat in Dhaka Thursday.

Mr. Maimanee described Bangladesh as the second biggest Muslim country in the world and highly appreciated its help and assistance in ending the illegal occupation of Kuwait.

The Ambassador said both Saudi Arabia and Kuwait had suffered from the unholy war imposed by Iraq.

It will take time to recover from the wounds and restore normally in the region, he added.

The Acting President reciprocated the sentiment of the Ambassador and expressed his belief that the custody of the two holy places of Mecca and Medina would remain in the proper hands.

He said Bangladesh would be happy to extend all cooperation to Saudi Arabia and Kuwait in their reconstruction and development activities.

The Acting President referred to the problems of Bangladeshi workers in Saudi Arabia who have remained stranded in Bangladesh due to the expiry of their entry visas following the suspension of the flights to and from Saudi Arabia during the Gulf war.

The Saudi Ambassador said that this problem and other similar matters would receive immediate attention of the Saudi government.

He had been suffering from paralysis for the last seven years.

Mustafizur Rahman was the Secretary General of the 'All Bengal and Assam Jamaatul 'alabayay Arabia' from 1938-39. He wrote many text books during his teaching life.

Two killed in road mishaps

A student of a girls' college and a minor boy were killed and two policemen injured in separate road accidents here Wednesday police said, reports BSS.

Miss Sadhana Baidya (17), a first year student of Muzaffarabad Joshadanandi Girls College, succumbed to her injuries at Patiya hospital where she was admitted after being run over by a bus at Patiya Wednesday morning. The mishap occurred when the bus suddenly surged forward before she could get down clearly. Police seized the bus but the driver and the helper managed to escape.

In another mishap, an eight-year old boy was run over by a jeep near Rauzan rubber garden Wednesday morning, the victim Kekarkishan Nath died on the spot. The killer jeep sped away towards Kaptai.

Two policemen were seriously injured when the van lost control and hit a road island at Dhampara Thursday morning. The policemen were admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital. The van was damaged.
