## New method may revolutionise country's sugarcane farming

From Our Correspondent

PABNA, March 18: A newly developed method known as Transplanting 'Spaced Technique' (STP), modified by cane agronomists at Sugarcane Research and Training Institute (SRTI) may revolutionise sugarcane cultivation in Bangladesh.

The technique involves germination of 'one eyed seedlings' in poly-bags or twoeyed seedlings on soil bed and then transplanting those in the field after certain period with appropriate spacing.

The STP method eliminates haphazard, random and gapping growth of cane as per conventional way of cultivation. Another important aspect of STP is low utilisation of canc seed. Under the conventional cultivation, about seven tons of cane seeds are required in one hectare of land. STP needs only one quarter of this quantity. Whereas it produces twice as much as sugarcane. If the total area under sugarcane cultivation used the STP method, savings on account of seed cane alone would come to nine lakh tons per year.

In 1985, SRTI introduced the STP technique on trial basis under the 'farming systems research programme'. Under a pilot production programme form 1987-1988 initiated by SRTI, about 41 farmers of Ishurdi were encouraged to cultivate 13 hectares using the STP method. The average yield per hectare was 84 tons from


