Mass media will be recast: Khaleda

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia today said mass media would be recast and reoriented to people's welfare services instead of self-promotion of any individual or party, reports UNB.

To this end, the Ministry of Information will be restructured enabling it to thrash out people's problems through special programmes for their resolution, she said at her first meeting with the high officials of the Ministry at the Secre-

The Prime Minister, in charge of the Information Ministry, said the mass media had been destroyed and debased to the publicity for self-promotion in the last nine years. "We would like to ensure

that the national media play their due role," Begum Zia told the information officials. The Prime Minister noted

with concern this ministry had done nothing good for the people during their movement against autocracy, as there was no democratic government in the country. "Now it's people's govern-

ment . . . it will direct its activities towards the welfare of the people." Stressing the need for de-
