One killed in road mishap

Pest menace

March 29: More than 10 thousand acres of rabi and boro crops have gone in the grip of 'mazrapest', according to Agriculture Extension Department.

But according to informed sources, the pest infested land will be more than what is said by the government sources.

AED sources said that the pest attack is on rise in Uzipur, Agiljhara, Gouradi, Muliadi and Bakerganj upazilas of the district.

AED sources also informed that in about two thousand five hundred acres of land have been saved from pest menace out of 8 thousand 163 acres of affected land in the district.

Peasants of different upazilas have urged the concerned authority to check the pest attack, immediately.

KISHOREGANJ

Development work reviewed

March 29: The monthly meeting of the Kishoreganj District Development Co-ordination Committee was held in the conference room of the Deputy Commissioner, Kishoreganj recently.

Kazi Nasrul Islam, Deputy Commissioner, presided over the meeting while all the Upazila Chairmen of the district, UNO's and other district officials attended the meeting.

The meeting reviewed the progress of development work and the problems facing the development projects.

Massive Boro farming plan

A massive programme has been undertaken to bring 13,293 hectares of land under Boro cultivation in 13 upazila here during the current season.

According to the Agriculture Extension Department, 1,18,171 will be brought under high yielding variety, 8,306 hectares under Pajam and the rest 6,446 hectares under local variety. The production target has been set at 3,30,501.81 metric tons of rice.

BADC has distributed seeds, fertilizers, insecticides and other inputs to the farmers for proper implementation of the programme.

Bangladesh Krishi Bank and other Commercial Banks have already distributed loans to make the plan a success.

Besides, BADC has arranged 256 demonstration plots for teaching the farmers the modern methods of Boro cultivation in the district.

MADRIPUR

Dacoity at night coach

March 29: A bus dacoity was committed at Madaripur recently. It is known from a police source, a Barisal bound night coach from Dhaka when reached near Kamaldi bridge of Rajoir upazila, a group of dacoits stopped the coach at gun point and robbed valuable from the passengers worth about Taka 37 thousand.

The dacoits injured the driver and three passengers. The driver and the injured passengers were admitted to Madaripur hospital. A case has been registered with Rajoir PS in this connection.

Two trollers collided head on in the Arial Khan river near Charminar bandar and one Hafiz Miah (30) is missing and three passengers were injured.

GAIBANDHA

Huge property gutted

March 29: Property worth several lakh Taka was burnt to ashes in four fire incidents in different upazilas of Gaibandha district during the last few days, reports BSS.

In a fire property worth about Taka two lakh was gutted at village Anantapur under Gobindaganj upazila recently.

Another fire broke out at village Ramdev under Sundarganj Upazila and burnt to ashes several dwelling houses. The loss was estimated at about Taka three lakh.

In another incident at Ganachara Upazila fire gutted

several houses.

Property of about Taka 2.5 lakh was destroyed at village Kuptala under Gaibandha Sadar Upazila.

In these fire incidents at least 13 cattle and 10 goats were roasted alive. Seven tinshed houses, 50 thatched houses, about 230 maunds of paddy and 20 maunds of molasses were gutted. At least 15 families were rendered homeless.

18 injured in road mishap

March 29: At least 18 passengers were injured in a road accident at Fultoil near the town on Bogra-Nagarbari highway Tuesday last, police said, reports UNB.

Witnesses said the mishap occurred when a Bogra bound night coach (Dhaka Metro 4916) hit an oil tanker which was lying on the road damaged due to an accident in the morning.

The injured were admitted to the Mohammad Ali hospital and a case has been filed in this connection.

PABNA

Pilferage of phone wires rampant

March 29: Pilferage of telephone wires from different lines is going on unabated in the district, it is alleged, reports UNB.

According to sources, nearly 60,000 metres of telephone lines worth about Taka 10 lakh were stolen during last three months.

As a result, a total of 300 telephone connections have been disrupted causing untold sufferings to the subscribers.

It is learnt that due to improper tele-communication link the railway authorities are facing acute problems in contacting other stations.

The pilferage of telephone wires have affected areas of Sing, Laskarpur and Nazirpur in Sadar and Ishurdi upazilas. Despite repeated appeal to solve the problem nothing has been done yet, it is alleged.

UZ chairman suspended for pre-polls violence

March 29: Charfection Upazila chairman Abdus Shahid Maiti was suspended for inciting pre-election violence and involvement in a corruption case official sources said here on Thursday, reports UNB.

The Deputy Commissioner, Bhola, conveying the suspension said the Upazila chairman with 50 to 60 unruly people on February attacked and damaged property of Principal Nazrul Islam, who was a candidate in the last parliamentary election from Bhola-4.

Shahid, he said, was also charge-sheeted in a corruption case by the anti-corruption department.

English teacher shortage in colleges, madrashas

JESSORE, March 29: Over 95 per cent senior Madrashas and 80 per cent non-government intermediate and degree colleges of the country lack requisite number of English teachers. High percentage of failure in English at Intermediate and Degree classes offers a miserable state of English education.

In many cases, guardians have to spend a large sum of money every year for their wards enabling them to appear at examination again and again till they pass the subject.

According to the prevailing rule, each senior Madrasha has to employ one regular lecturer in English, intermediate college — two lecturers and a degree college — three lecturers having at least two second divisions.

Besides, the educationists

having general university education do not like job in Madrashas. As a result, madrasha students do not have preliminary knowledge in English.

According to the survey reports, the Madrasha authorities advertise several times a year only to show the D.C. that they were trying to appoint an English lecturer. Applicants are very few. At times no candidate appear at the time of interview. The non-government colleges and madrashas of greater Barisal, greater Mymensingh, greater Khulna and Jessore are reportedly worst suffered.

On the other hand teachers of other subjects started private English coaching due to absence of English lecturers

and are earning a large sum of money in illegal way. If a new teacher joins in a college those teachers of vested interest take every measure to drive the English teacher out shortly. As a result, the posts of English teachers in those colleges remain vacant for years.

The survey reports say that some teachers serving in different colleges in Bangladesh holding Third Class Masters Degree from Indian Universities were enjoying full financial and other benefits, whereas experienced teachers holding the same qualification have to suffer much financial hardship.

Principals of non-government colleges and senior Madrashas narrated their bitter experience of non-availability of English lecturers.

PABNA, Mar 29: The residents of Pabna town and nine upazilas are facing scarcity of drinking water.

Accommodation problem may hamper wheat procurement

THAKURGAON, Mar 29: Lack of space in godowns, warehouse and silo, may hamper wheat procurement drive this season in the district.

On the other hand, due to shortage of railway wagons, Thakurgaon Food Department has failed to transit its previous food stock to different places.

According to the District Food Controller, Thakurgaon, a quantity of 24 thousand 400 hundred metric tons of rice paddy and wheat are stockpiled in 15 godowns of the district and at present no space is available. To clear the old stock with a view to making the space at least 1286 railway wagons are required, he said. But the Department has been supplied with only

Though there is a instruction by the higher authority to shift the stock to Dewanganj, Bhairab, Morarchar, Jaria, Fenchuganj, Kishoreganj and Sreepur, but the Thakurgaon Food Department cannot transit the same for lack of railway wagons.
