According to the non-official reports, 13 persons have already been killed by the Royal Bengal tigers in different places of the Sundarbans within a month.

## Patgram beset with multiple problems

From Our Correspondent

KURIGRAM, Mar 30: The inhabitants of Patgram upazila in Lalmonirhat district have been facing multifarious problems due to lack of basic amenities. Out of over 1.25 lakh inhab-

itants in seven unions 60 per cent of them are landless where agriculture is the main source of their livelihood and cultivation depends upon the mercy of the nature. The farmers of the upazilas

are not provided with necessary agricultural loans, seeds and fertilizers. As a result, the agricultural sector is still undeveloped resulting in poor

Besides, the growers hardly get fair prices for their produce because of bad communi cation. There is no metalled road which could be used during rainy season, and in absence of direct link road people of Dahagram-Angorpota enclave cannot come to Patgram upazila headquarters.

Mr. Rezanur Rahman Reza, an inhabitant of Dahagram Union said that the people of the upazila have long been suffering as they could not use "Tinbigha Corridor" to go to the upazila for purchasing the daily essentials.

The education sector, on the other hand, is very neglected there are 63 government primary schools, six high schools, three junior high schools and four Madrashas in the upazila most of which lack shortage teachers. The percentage of literacy is only 17

per cent there.

### Brickfields use firewood

A large number of brickfield


owners is using firewood for manufacturing bricks instead of coal in six southern districts. of the country. It is learnt that there are more than 4000 tons of coal in the government coal storage of

Barisal. The government price of cool per tone is Taka 2,964. Normally, 25-30 tons of coal are necessary to manufacture one lakh bricks. But more than 50 per cent brickfield owners use firewood (mainly Jhara wood) in lieu of coal. In this respect

brickfield owners alleged that the quality of government imported coal is not good having huge quantity of coal dust which is not really useable in brick fields for manufacturing good quality bricks. So owners of the brickfields try to use

firewoods. There are 150 brickfields in the districts Barisal Patuakhali, Jhalakalhi, Bhola,

Borguna and Pirojpur. Sometimes, concerned authority i.e. Forest Department with the help of law enforcing agencies try to check use of firewood in brickfields. In this connection, it is learnt, five cases were lodged against some brickfield owners and each case was settled with a fine of Taka 10,000 maximum instead of 6 months jail.
